

“ Great Britain ; and for permitting, from and
 “ after the passing thereof, until the said First Day
 “ of July One thousand eight hundred and three,
 “ the Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Bri-
 “ tain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt
 “ into Great Britain from Ireland :” And whereas
 His Majesty’s said Order in Council of the Thirty-
 first Day of December last has been further con-
 tinued until the Thirtieth Day of this instant April :

And whereas it is judged expedient that the said
 Prohibition to export, and the said Permission to
 import, should be continued for some Time longer,
 His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of
 His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers
 given by the First of the above-recited Acts, passed
 in the present Session of Parliament, hath thought
 fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the said
 Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first
 of December last, and all the Exceptions, Proviso-
 es, Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions, specified and
 enforced by the said Order, respecting such Ex-
 portation and Importation, and taking out of Ware-
 house, shall be, and continue in Force until the
 Thirty-first Day of May next inclusive, in the same
 Manner as the same are now in Force by the said
 Order, bearing Date the Thirty-first Day of De-
 cember last. And the Right Honorable the Lords
 Commissioners of His Majesty’s Treasury are to
 give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

CEREMONIAL of the Knighthood and Investiture
 of General Sir David Dundas Knight of the Most
 Honorable Military Order of the Bath.

THE Knights and Officers of the Order, attend-
 ing in the Privy Chamber, in their Mantles, Collars,
 &c. proceeded from thence into the Sovereign’s Pre-
 sence, making the usual Reverences, in the follow-
 ing Order :

Gentleman Usher of the Order, in his Mantle,
 Chain, and Badge, bearing the Scarlet Rod,
 Deputy Bath King of Arms, in the Mantle, Chain,
 and Badge of Bath, bearing the Ribbon and
 Badge of the Order on a Crimson Velvet Cushion.

The Dean of Westminster, Dean of the Order, in
 his Mantle, Chain, and Badge,
 His Royal Highness the Duke of York and Al-
 bany, First and principal Companion ;

Then, by the Sovereign’s Command, General
 Dundas was introduced into the Presence between
 the Right Honorable Sir William Fawcett and the
 Earl of Malmesbury, the Two Junior Knights pre-
 sent, preceded by the Gentlemen Usher of the Or-
 der, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was delivered to the Sove-
 reign by Lord De Blaquiere, the second Knight in
 Seniority, and General Dundas, kneeling, was
 knighted therewith. Then His Royal Highness
 the Duke of York, senior Knight, presented the
 Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Ma-

jefty put them over the new Knight’s Right Shoul-
 der, who, being thus invested, had the Honor to
 kiss His Majesty’s Hand, and the Procession re-
 turned to the Privy Chamber.

The Ceremony was performed in His Majesty’s
 Closet before the Drawing-Room, several of the
 great Officers of the Court being present.
