on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was allo gracioufly pleafed, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who flould fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man as His Majelty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majelty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing equal Date, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Sea-man, ht to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhould he taken for His Majelty's Service, on or before the Thirticth Day of April then next, by any of His Majelty's Sea Officers employed for railing Men: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations respectively, for Payment of faid the Bounties and Reward, will expire upon the Thirtieth Day of this initiant April : and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this infant April to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive; whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves Steph. Cottrell. accordingly.

RESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in His Majetty, by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act " to continue, until the First Day of January " One thousand eight hundred and four, feveral " Laws relating to the prohibiting the Exporta-" tion and permitting the Importation of Corn, " and for allowing the Importation of other Ar-" ticles of Provision without Payment of Duty; " to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect " to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods " in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the " Trade and Commerce to and from the Ifle of " Malta ;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Or-den in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December lak, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That the Prohibition laid, by Order of His Majelty in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, upon the Exportation from any Port or Place in Great Britain of any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit, or Malt made thereof, or of any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour raade thereof; and also the Liberty, granted by the faid Order in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, to import and take out of Warehouse Fo- Confpiracy against your Majelty's facred Person and

reign Corn and other Articles as aforefaid, and likewife to import fundry other Articles of Provision Duty free, should be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March Irst, fave and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, as it was declared by the faid Order, that nothing therein contained was intended to extend, or should be construed to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for continuing, until the First Day of July One " thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made " in the Forty-fecond Year of the Reign of His " prefent Majelty, intituled An Act for regulating, until the Fifteenth Day of February One thou-" fand eight hundred and three, the Prices at which Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to Great Britain ; and for permisting, from and after the passing thereof, until the faid First Day " of July One thousand eight hundred and three, " the Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt " into Great Britain from Ireland :" And whereas His Majefty's faid Order in Council of the Thirty-first Day of December last has been further continued until the Thirtieth Day of this instant April :

And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition to export, and the faid Permiffion to import, should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majelly, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers given by the First of the above-recited Acts, passed in the present Selfion of Parliament, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December last, and all the Exceptions, Provisoes, Rules. Regulations, and Reftrictions, fpecified and enforced by the faid Order, refpecting fuch Ex-portation and Importation, and taking out of Warehouse, shall be, and continue in Force until the Thirty-first Day of May next inclusive, in the same Manner as the fame are now in Force by the faid Order, bearing Date the Thirty-first Day of December last. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly.
