PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R. HEREAS Patrick Earl of Dumfries was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the Houfe of Peers in the prefent Parliamen: of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is fince deceased, in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to fit in his Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue forth this Proclamation, ftrictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to allemble and meet at Holy-Rood Houle, in Edinburgh, on Thursday the Sixteenth Day of June next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choofe another Peer of Scotland to fit and vote in the House of Peers of this prefent Parliament of the United King-dom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the Room of the faid Patrick Earl of Dumfries, deceafed, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that fhall then be prefent, and of the Proxies of fuch as thall be absent (luch Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly figned before Witnelles, and both Conflituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Cierk Regilter, or fuch Two of the Principal Clerks of the Selfon as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby refpectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after fuch Eleftion made, and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer fo elected, and fign and attelt the fame in the Preferce of the faid Peers the Electors, and return fuch Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And we itricity charge and command, that this Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross, at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns in Scotland, Twenty-five Days at least, before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed on fuch Election:

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Fourth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and ahree, in the Forty-third Year of Our Reign. GOD fave the KING.
