MITHEREAS an Act of Parliament was pailed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, intituled " An Act to empower His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Salt Petre; and to enforce " the Law for empowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to empower " His Majelty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of " Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or " Ammunition :" And His Majefty judging it neceffary to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition out of this Kingdom, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, for fome Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Two Months from the Date of this Order in Council, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by the aforementioned Act: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. PRESENT, The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council, HEREAS, by an Act paffed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majelly's Reign, int tuled "An Act to enable His Majefly to reffrain " the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effec-" tually to prevent the Exportation of Salt Petre. " Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by " Proclamation or Order in Council," it is enacted, amongft other Things, That His Majefty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, when he fhail fee Caufe, and for fuch Time as fhail be therein expreffed, prohibit the exporting, or the attempting to export, Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, and other Naval Stores : And His Majefty, judging it neceffary to prohibit the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles for a limited Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever do at any Time, during the Space of Two Months from the Date of this Order in Council, prefume to tranfport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig. Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpintine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do fhip or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion first being had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by the aforementioned Act: But it is nevertheleis His Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing hercia contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships

or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majelly's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coalt of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpofes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majelly's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majelly's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Deftination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majelty's Cuftoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Outwards, and for the Purpofes fpecified, and none other; and fuch Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiffioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners and fpecified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiflioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as no them may refpec-W. ### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. T is this Day ordered by His Majefty in Council, That all Ships and Veffels clearing out for the Coaft of Africa for the Purpole of carrying on the

Trade there, be permitted to take on board, as an afforted Part of their Cargoes, as much Gunpowder, and as large a Quantity of Trading Guns, Piftols, Cutlaffes, Flints, and Lead Balls, Bars, and Shot as the Exporters shall think necessary, notwithstanding any Thing contained in His Majesty's Order in Council of the Sixth Day of April laft; provided that fufficient Security be given to the Principal Officers of His Majelty's Cultoms of the Port in which the Ships are fitted out, and before they proceed on their refpective Voyages, in treble the Value of the Articles exported, that the fame fhall be expended in Trade upon the Coast of Africa; which Security is not to be cancelled until Proof of fuch Expenditure has been made by the Oath of the Captain or Mafter of the Ship or Veffel in like Manner as is practifed with regard to Spirits and East India Goods used in carrying on that Trade ; and His Majefty is further pleafed to order. That all Ships and Veffels trading to the faid Coaft, be allowed to take on board for their Defence whatever Quantity of Carriage Guns, Swivels, and fmall Arms, shall be judged proper by the respective Mafters thereof; provided that no greater Quan. tity be taken on board any one Ship for her Defence than Twelve Carriage Guns and Twelve Swivels, together with one Mulket or Blunderbufs, one Pair of Piftols and one Cutlafs for every Perfon of which the Ship's Company shall confift, and Ammunition in Proportion; and provided alfo, that fufficient Security be in like Manner given to the faid Principal Officers of the Cuftoms at the Ports where the Ships shall be fitted out, in treble the Value of the Carriage Guns, Swivels, and fmall Arms fo taken on board for the Defence of the faid Ships to bring back the faid Carriage Guns, Swivels, and fmall Arms when the Voyage is completed, and to account upon Oath for the Expenditure of the Ammunition : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefly's Treafury are to give the neceffary herein accordingly.
