A T the Court at the Queen's Paluce, the 16th of May 1803,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS, in Consequence of the repeated Infults and Provocations which His Majesty has experienced from the Government of France, His Majesty finds himself compelled to take such Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honor of His Crown, and the just Rights of His Subjects; His Majesty, therefore, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprifals be granted against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the French Republic, fo that as well His Majesty's Fleets and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commissionated, by Letters of Marque, or General Reprifals, or otherwife, by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to the French Republic, or to any Perfons being Subjects of the French Republic, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of the French Republic, and bring the same to Judgment in such Courts of Admiralty within His Majelly's Dominious, as shall be duly commissionated to take Cognizance thereof; and, to that End, His Majelly's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commission, and present the same to His Majelly at this Board, authorising the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to iffue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprifals to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others whom the said Commissioners shall deem sitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, seizing, and taking the Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to the French Republic, or to any Persons being Subjects of the French Republic, or inhabiting within any of the

Territories of the French Republic; and that such Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commission, as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents; and His Majesty's said Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty. are also forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commillion, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authoriting the faid Commissioners for exeenting the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, His Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions which shall be duly commissionated to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprifals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be made, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the Course of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all such Ships, Vessels, and Goods as shall belong to the French Republic, or to any Perfons being Subjects of the French Republic, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of the French Republic; and that such Powers and Claufes be inserted in the faid Commission as have been usual and are according to former Precedents; and they are likewise to prepare and lay before His Majesty at this Board a Draft of fuch Instructions as may be proper to be fent to the faid several Courts of Admiralty in His Majelly's foreign Governments and Plantations for their Guidance herein; as also another Draft of Intructions for fuch Ships as shall be commisfionated for the Purpoles above-mentioned.

By the KING. A PROCLAMATION,

For encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on board His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and Landmen who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Scamen not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Five Pounds each Man: and all fuch Ordinary Scamen, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds Ten Shillings each Man; and all fuch Able bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who shall so enter themselves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty, in Lieu of the Bounties promifed in Our Royal Proclamation dated the Seventh Day of March last; such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the

Cheeque refiding at the Ports where the Ships or Vessels on board which such Seamen and Landmen may be appointed to ferve, shall be immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen or Landmen; And We do declare, that the Qualifications of the Seamen and Landmen fo entering themselves, shall he certified by the Captain, Ma'ter, and Boatfwain of the Ship or Veffel on board which they shall be appointed to ferve: And for Prevention of any Abuses, by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on Board any other Our Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money, We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Seamen and Landmen belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as shall abfent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on board any other of our faid Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lofe the Wages one to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be punished according to their

GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom: And whereas Attempts may be made to feduce fome of Our Subjects, contrary to their Allegiance and Duty to Us, to enter on board Ships or Vessels of War, or other Ships or Vessels belonging to the French and Batavian Republics, with Intent to commit Hoslilities against Us or Our Subjects, or otherwise to adhere, or give Aid or Comfort to Our Enemies upon the Sea: Now We, in order that none of Our Subjects may ignorantly incur the Guilt and Penalties of fach Breaches of their Allegiance and Duty, have thought it necessary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby notifying and declaring, that all Persons, being Our Subjects, who shall enter or serve, or be found on board any Ships or Veffels of War, or other Ships or Veffels belonging to the French or Batavian Republics, with Intent to commit Hostilities against Us or Our Subjects, or who shall otherwise adhere, or give Aid or Comfort to Our Enemies upon the Sea, will thereby become liable to fuffer the Pains of Death, and all other Pains and Penalties of High Treason and Piracy; and We do hereby

declare Our Royal Intention and firm Resolution to proceed against all such Offenders according to Law.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. T is this Day ordered by His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, That no Ships or Veffels, belonging to any of His Majetty's Subjects, be permitted to enter and clear out for any of the Ports of the French or Batavian Republics, or for the Ports of any Country occupied by the Armies of France, until further Order; and His Majesty is further pleased to order, That a General Embargo or Stop be made on all Ships, belonging to the French and Batavian Republics whatfoever, now within or which hereafter shall come into any of the Ports, Harbours, or Roads, within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all Persons and Effects on board the said Ships and Vessels; but that the utmost Care be taken for the Preservation of all and every Part of the Cargoes on board any of the faid Ships, so that no Damage or Embezzlement whatever be fustained; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majelty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majelty in Council. WHEREAS an Act of Parliament was passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled " An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit " the Exportation of Salt Petre; and to enforce " the Law for empowering His Majelly to prohibit " the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition; and also to empower " His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of "Salt Petse, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or "Ammunition:" And His Majefty judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpow-der or Salt Petrc, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-nition out of this Kingdom, or carrying the same Coastwise, for some Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command that no Person or Persons whatloever, (except the Master General of the Ord-

nance for His Majefly's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Two Months from the Date of this Order in Council, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by the aforementioned Act: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Maller-General of the Ordnance, and His Majelly's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. A T the Court at the Queen's-Palace, the 11th of May 1803,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the Thirtythird Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain. " the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effec-" tually to prevent the Exportation of Salt Petre, "Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council," it is enacted, amongst other Things, That His Majesty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, when he shall fee Cause, and for such Time as shall be therein expressed, prohibit the exporting, or the attempting to export, Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, Auchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, and other Naval Stores: And His Majelly. judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of the said several Articles for a limited Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do at any Time, during the Space of Two Months from the Date of this Order in Council, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pigtron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpin-tine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permillion first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by the aforementioned Act: But it is nevertheless His Majelty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majelty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of

Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majelty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commillioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majetty's Yards or Garrilous, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purpeles of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the feid Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the ne-ceffary Directions herein as to them may respec-W. T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 18th of May 1803,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

T is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, That all Ships and Vellels clearing out for the Coast of Africa for the Purpose of carrying on the Trade there, be permitted to take on board, as an afforted Part of their Cargoes, as much Gunpowder, and as large a Quantity of Trading Guns, Pistols, Cutlaffes, Flints, and Lead Balls, Bars, and Shot as the Exporters shall think necessary, notwith-standing any Thing contained in His Majesty's Order in Council of the Sixth Day of April last; provided that sufficient Security be given to the Principal Officers of His Majesty's Customs of the Port in which the Ships are fatted out, and before

the Value of the Articles exported, that the same shall be expended in Trade upon the Coast of Africa; which Security is not to be cancelled until Proof of fuch Expenditure has been made by the Oath of the Captain or Mafter of the Ship or Vessel in like Manner as is practifed with regard to Spirits and East India Goods used in carrying on that Trade; and His Majesty is further pleased to order, That all Ships and Veffels trading to the faid Coast. be allowed to take on board for their Defence whatever Quantity of Carriage Guns, Swivels, and fmall Arms, shall be judged proper by the respective Masters thereof; provided that no greater Quantity be taken on board any one Ship for her Desence than Twelve Carriage Guns and Twelve Swivels, together with one Masket or Blunderbusc, one Pair of Pillols and one Cutlafs for every Person of which the Ship's Company shall consist, and Ammunition in Proportion; and provided also, that fufficient Security be in like Manner given to the faid Principal Officers of the Cultoms at the Ports where the Ships shall be fitted out, in treble the Value of the Carriage Guns, Swivels, and small Arms to taken on board for the Defence of the faid Ships to bring back the faid Carriage Guns, Swivels, and finall Arms when the Voyage is completed, and to account upon Oath for the Expenditure of the Ammunition: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary herein accordingly. VHEREAS Patrick Earl of Dumfries was duly elected and returned to be one of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, to fit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased, in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to fit in his Room, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to affemble and meet at Holy-Rood-Houfe, in Edinburgh, on Thursday the Sixteenth Day of June next, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Afternoon, to nominate and choose another Peer of Scotland to fit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the Room of the faid Patrick Earl of Dumfries, deceased, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall then be present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent (such Proxies being Peers, and producing a Mandate in Writing duly signed before Witnelles, and both Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law); and the Lord Clerk Register, or fuch Two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend fuch Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately after such Election made, and duly examined, to certify the Name of the Peer so elected, and fign they proceed on their respective Voyages, in treble and attest the same in the Presence of the faed

Peers the Electors, and return such Certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And we strictly charge and command, that this Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross, at Edinburgh, and in all the County Towns in Scotland, Twenty-five Days at least, before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed on fuch Election.
