one, to import and take out of Warehouse Foreign Corn and other Articles as aforefaid, and likewife to import fundry other Articles of Provision Duty free, should be further continued until the Thirty first Day of March last, save and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, as it was declared by the faid Order, that nothing therein contained was intended to extend, or should be construed to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act " for continuing, until the First Day of July One " thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made " in the Forty-second Year of the Reign of His " present Majesty, intituled An Act for regulating, " until the Fifteenth Day of February One thou-" fand eight hundred and three, the Prices at which "Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from "Great Britain to Ireland, and from Ireland to "Great Britain; and for permitting, from and " after the passing thereof, until the said First Day " of July One thousand eight hundred and three, " the Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Bri-" tain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt " into Great Britain from Ireland:"

And whereas His Majesty's said Order in Council of the Thirty-sirst Day of December last, has been further continued until the Thirty-sirst Day of this instant May:

And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition to export, and the faid Permission to import, should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers given by the First of the above-recited Acts, passed in the present Session of Parliament, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December last, and all the Exceptions, Provisoes, Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions, specified and enforced by the faid Order, respecting such Exportation and Importation, and taking out of Warehouse, shall be, and continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive, in the same Manner as the same are now in Force by the said Order, bearing Date the Thirty-first Day of December laft. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

has experienced from the Government of France, His Majesty finds himself compelled to take such Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honor of His Crown, and the just Rights of His Subjects; His Majesty, therefore, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprisals be granted against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the French Republic, so that as well. His Majesty's Fleets and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commissionated, by Letters of Marque, or General Reprifals, or otherwife, by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to the French Republic, or to any Persons being Subjects of the French Republic, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of the French Republic, and bring the same to Judgment in such Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, as shall be duly commissionated to take Cognizance thereof; and, to that End, His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authorising the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to iffue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprifals to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others whom the faid Commillioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing, and taking the Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to the French Republic, or to any Persons being Subjects of the French Republic, or inhabiting within an of the Territories of the French Republic; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission, as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents; and His Majesty's said Advo-cate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draft of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at this Board, authoriting the faid Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great-Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, His Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the several Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions which shall be duly commissionated to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprifals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be made, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the Course of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Vessels, and Goods as shall belong to the French Republic, or to any Persons being Subjects of the French Republic, or inhabiting within any of the Territories of the French Republic; and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commission as have been usual and are according to former Precedents; and they are likewise to prepare and lay before His Majetty at this Board a Draft of fuch Instructions as may be proper to be fent to the said several Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's foreign Governments and Plantations for their Guidance herein; as also another Draft of Instructions for such Ships as shall be commis-
