NOTICE is hereby given, that there will be a Levee at St. James's on Wednesday next the 1st, and a Drawing-Room on Saturday the 4th, of June, His Majesty's Birth-Day.

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Sixth Day of April last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of June next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Sixth Day of June next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwise, any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the

" Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. *W. A P R O C L A M A T I O N,

For increasing the Militia.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Number of Our Militia Forces should be increased without Delay: And whereas the Occasion thereof hath been communicated to Parliament: We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby, in pursuance of the Powers which are vested in Us by an Act passed in the Forty-second Year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act for amending the Laws relating to the Militia in England, and for augmenting the Militia," and of another Act passed in the same Year, intituled "An Act to raise and establish a Militia Force in Scotland," order and direct that, in Addition to the Number of Men already required to be raised under the said Acts by the several Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places therein mentioned, there shall forthwith be raised and enrolled in the said several Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places therein mentioned, respectively, such a Number of Men as may amount to, but not exceed the Proportion of One-Half of the whole Number of Men required to be raised by the said Acts in each County, Riding, Stewartry, City, and Place respectively: And We do hereby
