Given at Our Court at St James's, the Twentyfixth Day of May, in the Year of our Lord One thouland eight hundred and three, in the Forty-third Year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majelly in Council. THERFAS, in purfuance of the Powers vefted W in His Majefly, by an Act pafied in the prefent S.flion of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the First Day of January " One thousand eight hundred and four, feveral " Laws relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Ar-" ticles of Provision without Payment of Duty; " to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect " to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods " in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the " Trade and Commerce to and from the life of " Malta ;" His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty first of December laft, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That the Prohibition laid, by Order of His Majelly in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of Decomber One thousand eight hundred and one. upon the Exportation from any Port or Place in Great Britain of any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flom, or Bread, Bilcuit, or Malt made thereof, or of any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and alfo the Liberty, granted by the fa d Order in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, to import and take out of Warehoufe Foreign Cora and other Articles as aforefaid, and likewife to import fundry other Articles of Provilion Duty free, flould be further continued until the Thirty fait Day of March laft, fave and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, as it was declared by the faid Order, that nothing therein contained was intended to extend, or fhould be confirmed to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britaia to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act pathed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, initialed "An Act for continuing, until the First Day of July One 4 thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made 44 in the Forty-fecond Year of the Reign of His I

" prefent Majefly, intituled An A& for regulating, " until the Fifteenth Day of February One thon-" fand eight hundred and three, the Prices at which " Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from " Grear Britain to Ircland, and fr an Ircland to " Great Britain ; and for permitting, from and " after the paffing thereof, until the faid Firth Day " of July One thousand eight hundred and three, " the Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Bri-" tain to Ircland, and the Importation of Malt " into Great Britain from Ircland :"

And whereas His Majetty's faid Order in Council of the Thirty-firft Day of December laft, has been further continued until the Thirty-firft Day of this inflant May:

And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition to export, and the faid Permifician to import, fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majelly, therefore, by and with the Ad c: of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the First of the above-recited Acts, passed in the prefent Sellion of Parliament, hath thought lit to order, and it is hereby ordered. That the faid Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-firit of December laft, and all the Exceptions, Provifoes. Rules Regulations, and Reffrictions, fpecified and enforced by the faid Order, refpecting fuch Exportation and Importation, and taking out of Warehouse, shall be, and continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive, in the fame Manner as the fame are now in Force by the faid Order, bearing Date the Thirty-first Day of De-cember last. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury are to give the necefiary Directions herein accordingly.
