ceived, under the faid Convention, to a much greater Amount than the Money to be distributed, and the Commissioners, while they prevent, as far as in them lies, all unnecessary Discussion and Delay, will nevertheless proceed so as to ensure as much as possible the Means of full Invelligation, and of equal Juffice to all concerned, Notice is hereby given, that the feveral Claims, Schedules, and Accounts, with a Life of all the Claimants, will be open at this Office for the inspection of every Claimant, or the authorifld Agent of fuch Claimant, who may flate fuch Oli, ctions in Writing (duly figued by fuch Claimant or Agent) as he may defire to have submitted to the Confideration of the Commissioners; which Objections the faid Commissioners, if they see Cause fo to do, will allow the respective Claimants against whole Claims, in the Whole or in Part, the same shall be directed, to see and answer; such Inspection of Claims to be made in the Manner, and according to the Rules, which, with the general Orders of the

Board for regulating the Course of the Proceedings before them, will be communicated at this Office.
