A PROCLAMATION, For increasing the Militia.

GEORGE R. HEREAS it is expedient that the Number of Our Militia Forces should be increased without Delay : And whereas the Occasion thereof hath been communicated to Parliament : We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby, in purfuance of the Powers which are vested in Us by an Act passed in the Forty-second Year of Our Reign, initialed "An " Act for amending the Laws relating to the Mi-"litia in England, and for augmenting to the Mi-"litia," and of another Act paffed in the fame Year, intituled "An Act to raife and establish a "Militia Force in Scotland," order and direct that, in Addition to the Number of Men already required to be raifed under the faid Acts by the feveral Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places therein mentioned, there shall forthwith be raifed and enrolled in the faid feveral Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places therein mentioned, refpectively, fuch a Number of Men as may amount to, but not exceed the Proportion of One Half of the whole Number of Men required to be railed by the faid Acts in each County, Riding, Stewartry, City, and Place respectively: And We do hereby further order and direct Our Lieutenants and De puty Lieutenants refpectively, of the faid feveral Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places, immediately to affemble and forthwith proceed to apportion the Number of Men hereby required to he raifed in their respective Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Citics, and Places among the feveral Hundreds, Rapes, Lathes, Wapentakes, or other Divisions, and also among the fe eral Parishes, Tythings, or Places therein respectively, and there-after to proceed to raise and enrol such Men on or before the Sixteenth Day of July next enfuing.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfixth Day of May, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and three, in the Forty-third Year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council, WHEREAS, in purfuance of the Powers vefted W in His Majefty, by an Act passed in the prefent Sellion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " to continue, until the First Day of January "One thousand eight hundred and four, feveral "Laws relating to the prohibiting the Exporta-"tion and permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Ar-ticles of Provision without Payment of Duty; to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goodz " " in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the "Trade and Commerce to and from the Ifle of " Malta ;" His Majefly was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December laft, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That the Prohibition laid, by Order of His Majelty in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, upon the Exportation from any Port or Place in Great Britain of any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peale, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit, or Malt made thereof, or of any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and also the Liberty, granted by the faid Order in Council. bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thouland eight hundred and one, to import and take out of Warehoufe Fo-reign Corn and other Articles as aforefaid, and likewife to import fundry other Articles of Provision Duty free, should be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March last, save and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, as it was declared by the faid Order, that nothing therein contained was intended to extend, or fhould be confirued to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any-Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manuer authorized by an Act paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act "for continuing, until the First Day of July One "thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made

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" in the Forty-fecond Year of the Reign of His 1 " prefent Majefty, intituled An Act for regulating, " until the Fifteenth, Day of February One thou-" fand eight hundred and three, the Prices at which " Grain, Meal, and Flour may be exported from " Great Britain to Ireland, and fr.m Ireland to " Great Britain ; and for permitting, from and " after the passing thereof, until the faid First Day " of July One thousand eight hundred and three, " the Exportation of Seed Conn from Great Bri " tain to Ireland, and the Importation of Malt " into Great Britain from Ireland :"

And whereas His Majelty's faid Order in Council of the Thirty-first Day of December last, has been further continued until the Thirty-first Day of this inflant May :

And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition to export, and the faid Permiffion to import, flould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty, therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the First of the above-recited Acts, passed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, hath thought fit to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the faid Order in Conncil, bearing Date the Thirty first of December last, and all the Exceptions, Providees Rules Regulations, and Reftrictions, specified and enforced by the faid Order. refpecting fuch Exportation and Importation, and taking out of Ware-houfe, faall be, and continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive, in the fame Manner as the fame are now in Force by the faid Order, bearing Date the Thirty-first Day of December lait. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the neceffary Directions herein accordingly. W. Fawkener.

St. James's, June 7, 1803.
