PROCLAMATION,

For increasing the Militia.

GEORGE

HEREAS it is expedient that the Number of Our Militia Forces should be increased without Delay: And whereas the Occasion thereof hath been communicated to Parliament: We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby, in pursuance of the Powers which are vested in Us by an Act passed in the Forty-second Year of Our Reign, intituled "An " Act for amending the Laws relating to the Mi-"litia in England, and for augmenting the Mi-"litia," and of another Act passed in the same Year, intituled "An Act to raise and establish a "Militia Force in Scotland," order and direct that, in Addition to the Number of Men already required to be raifed under the faid Acts by the feveral Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places therein mentioned, there shall forthwith be raifed and enrolled in the faid feveral Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places therein mentioned, respectively, such a Number of Men as may amount to, but not exceed the Proportion of One Half of the whole Number of Men required to be railed by the faid Acts in each County, Riding, Stewartry, City, and Place respectively: And We do hereby further order and direct Our Lieutenants and De puty Lieutenants respectively, of the said several Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places, immediately to affemble and forthwith proceed to apportion the Number of Men hereby required to he raifed in their respective Counties, Ridings, Stewartries, Cities, and Places among the feveral Hundreds, Rapes, Lathes, Wapentakes, or other Divisions, and also among the se eral Parishes, Tythings, or Places therein respectively, and there-after to proceed to raise and enrol such Men on or before the Sixteenth Day of July next enfuing.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfixth Day of May, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and three, in the Forty-third Year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, WHEREAS, in purfuance of the Powers vefted VV in His Majesty, by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act "One thousand eight hundred and four, several Laws relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty; to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods " in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of " Malta;" His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December lait, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That the Prohibition laid, by Order of His Majelty in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, upon the Exportation from any Port or Place in Great Britain of any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit, or Malt made thereof, or of any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and also the Liberty, granted by the said Order in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, to import and take out of Warehouse Foreign Corn and other Articles as aforesaid, and likewise to import fundry other Articles of Provision Duty free, should be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March last, save and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice and Malt; and fave and except, as it was declared by the faid Order, that nothing therein contained was intended to extend, or should be construed to extend, to affect or apply to any Exportation of Seed Corn from Great Britain to Ireland, or any Importation of Malt from Ireland to Great Britain, in the Manner authorized by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for continuing, until the First Day of July One thousand eight hundred and three, an Act made
