## PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS, in virtue of the Powers velted in His Majefty by an Act, paffed in the FortyGrft Year of His Majefty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majelty to regulate the " Trade and Commerce to and from the Inc of " Malta until the figning a Defnitivé Treaty of " Peace, and from theace until Six Wecks after the " next Meeting sf Parliament, and to declare the " Ifle of Malta to be Part of Europe:" His Majefty was' pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieti: of July One thoufand eight hundred and cne, to order andi declare, that the Port of La Va'ste, in the faid MRand of Malta, thould be takce to be, and the fame was thereby made, a free Po: for the Importation into, and Exportaton from tioc Eme, cf ail Sorts of Goods and Mierchandizes in tra.....g Ships or Veffels.belongjug to Subjcets of States in Amity with His Majefty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatevet Manner fuch Ships or $V$ effels fhould be navigated; and fhould continue to be fuch free Port until the figning of a Defnitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Pa:izere:ats, uniefs His Majenty fhould in the mean Time otherwife order, fubject, neverthelefs, to fuch Regulations for the Security of the Poffefion of the Tland of Malta and its Dependencies, and ? 2 Protecion of the Health of the Garrifon, and Inhabitants thereof, as might be then in Force, or fhouid from Time to Time be deemed necfffary or expedient in that Behalf; and that the fame Drawbacks and Bounties, and upon the fame Terms and Conditions which then were, or thereafter might be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of any Goods and Merchandizes to the Mlands of Minorca, or to Gibralcar, Thould and might be allowed upon the Exportation
of the like Goods and Merchandizes to the Port of La Valcite, in the Ifand of Malta : And whereas by an Act, paffed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the
"Firt Day of January One thoufand eight hun"s dred and four, feveral Laws relating to the pro"s hibiting the Exportation and permitting the Im" portation of Corn, and for allowing the Importa" tion of other Articles of Provifion, without Pay-
" ment of Duty; to the Relief of Captors of
"Prizes, with refpect to the bringing and landing
" certain Prize Goods in this Kingaom; and to
" the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and "from the Ine of Malta :" It is $\epsilon$ nacred, that the faid Act, and all the Powers and Frovifions therein contained, fhall continuc in full Force and Effect until the Firf Day of january One thoufand eight hundred and four; His Majely is thereupon plealed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Order made by His Majefty in Council on the Thir*ieth Day of July One thoufand eight hundred and one, fhall be, and be deemed, and taken to be, in Force until the Firf Day of January One thoufand eight hundred and four, unlefs His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, fhall think fic otherwife to order and direct. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commifioners for executing the Ofice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britaia, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the neseffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
