## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. 7 HEREAS, in virtue of the Powers velled in His Majesty by an Act, passed in the Fortyfirst Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An " Act to empower His Majefty to regulate the " Trade and Commerce to and from the Ifle of " Malta until the figning a Definitive Treaty of " Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the ." next Meeting of Parliament, and to declare the " Ifle of Malta to be Part of Europe :" His Majefty was pleased, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieth of July Oue thousand eight hundred and one, to order and declare, that the Port of La Valette, in the faid Island of Malta, should be taken to be, and the fame was thereby made, a free Port for the Importation into, and Exportation from the fame, of all Sorts of Goods and Merchandizes in trading Ships or Veffels belonging to Subjects of States in Amity with His Majefty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatever Manner fuch Ships or Veffels should be navigated; and should continue to be such free Port until the figning of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, unlefs His Majefly should in the mean Time otherwife order, fubject, neverthelefs, to fuch Regulations for the Security of the Poffession of the Island of Malta and its Dependencies, and the Protection of the Health of the Garrifon, and Inhabitants thereof, as might be then in Force, or fhould from Time to Time be deemed neceffary or expedient in that Behalf; and that the fame Drawbacks and Bounties, and upon the fame Terms and Conditions which then were, or thereafter might be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of any Goods and Merchandizes to the Islands of Minorca, or to Gibraltar, should and might be allowed upon the Exportation

T the Court at St. James's, the 8th Day of 1 of the like Goods and Merchandizes to the Port of La Valette, in the Island of Malta : And whereas by an AA, passed in the prefent Sellion of Parliament, intituled " An A& to continue, until the " First Day of January One thousand eight hun-" dred and four, feveral Laws relating to the pro-" hibiting the Exportation and permitting the Im-" portation of Corn, and for allowing the Importa-" tion of other Articles of Provision, without Pay-" ment of Duty; to the Relief of Captors of " Prizes, with refpect to the bringing and landing " certain Prize Goods in this Kingdom; and to " the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and " from the Isle of Malta :" It is enacted, that the faid Act, and all the Powers and Provisions therein contained, shall continue in full Force and Effect until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majelly is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the faid Order made by His Majelty in Council on the Thirtieth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and one, shall be, and be deemed, and taken to be, in Force until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four, unless His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, shall think fit, otherwife to order and direct. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
