Men, who, having been fworn and enrolled in HIS MAJESTY's MILITIA FORCES, have made Default, by not appearing and joining their refpective Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Comparies when ordered to be embodied, or by deferting or abfenting themfelves therefrom, and who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Cher of HIS MAJESTY's GRACIOUS PARDON, and that fuch an Inftance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; HIS MAJESTY has accordingly been gracioufly pleafed to grant HIS FREE PARDON to all MILITIA-MEN hav-ing fo made Default by not appearing, or by Defertion, or Abfence from Duty, who shall return to and join their respective Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies, on or before the 14th Day of July next, or who shall deliver them-felves up at the Head-Quarters of any other Regi-ment; Battalion, Corps, or Independent Company of Militia, or to any Detachment of HIS MA-JESTY's other Forces, or to any Military-Poft, on or before the faid r4th Day of July next, and be from thence marched to their proper Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies.

Any Soldier who may defert from the Militia after thefe HIS MAJESTY's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but shall be proceeded against with the utmost Severity; as shall also all the faid Defaulters, Deferters, and Abfentees who fhall not have joined their proper Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or In-dependent Companies of Militia, or delivered themfelves up to fome other Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Independent Company of Militia, or to fome Detachment of His Majefty's other Forces, or to fome Military Post, by the faid 14th Day of July mex1.

And all Juffices of the Peace, Magistrates, Con-fables, and Peace Officers, and all other Perfons whatloever, are hereby enjoined and required, in purfuance of the Act just passed in required, in "diy completing the Militia of Great Britain;" to apprehend, feize, take, and detain fuch Defaulters, Delerters, and Ablentees, for the Purpole of delivering them into fafe Cuftody at any Military Inead Quarters, or into Gaol near to the Place where they shall be apprehended, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law : and all fuch of the faid Defaulters, Deferters, or Absentees, as were enrolled as Substitutes or Volunteers in the Militia, shall, upon being identified before any General, Regimental, or Detachment Court Martial, be forthwith fent to ferve in HIS MAJESTY's Regular Forces flationed Abroad, until duly difcharged therefrom; and the Perfon or Perfons who fnall apprehend and detain any fuch Defaulter, Deferter, or Ablentee from the Militia, and deliver him into fafe Cuftody as aforefaid, fhall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings over and above the Reward of Twenty Shillings to which such Person or Persons will also be entitled under the Mutiny Act, and |
