The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majefty was gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May last, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Ablebodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirtyfive nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majelly's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March laft, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Sezman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's Service, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirticth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Reward was, by Order in Council, prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of April | September next, inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons

being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service. that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant June to the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive : whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves accordingly. WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An A& " to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight hundred and four, several Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for " allowing the Importation of other Articles of " Provision without Payment of Duty; to the " Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the " bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this " Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and " Commerce to and from the Ifle of Malta;" It is among other Things, enacted, That certain Acte therein mentioned relating to the Exportation and Importation of Corn, and other Articles of Provition fhould be, and the fame were thereby continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Acts, iz hereby pleafed to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this inftant June, until the Thirticth Day of
