PRESENT, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Eleventh Day of May last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Fig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, His Majesty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eleventh Day of July next, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rolin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Malts, Yards, Bowlprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or Ship or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty " to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and " more effectually to prevent the Exportation of " Salt Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when pro-

But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majelty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necesfary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the faid several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Planta. tions in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are fo entered Ouwards, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by " hibited by Proclamation or Order in Councils" the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May last, to promile and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Ivianner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Licutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majelty was graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Ablehodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March last to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefly's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majefly's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the taid Reward was, by Order in Council, prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of April to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majetty's Service, that the faud Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majelly, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly. PRESENT, The KING's Molt Excellent Majetty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight handred and four, several Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of "Provision without Payment of Dury; to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and " Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" is among other Things, enacted, That certain Acts therein mentioned relating to the Exportation and Importation of Corn, and other Articles of Pro-vision should be, and the same were thereby continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majetty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Acts, is hereby pleafed to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this instant June, until the Thirtieth Day of September next, inclusive, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beel, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, or Butter, unless Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles so to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that nothing contained in this His Majesty's Order shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the laid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Sullenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Pallengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Vessel, or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesly's Ships of War, or other Ships and Vessels in His Majelty's Service; or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Forces, Forts, or Garrisons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of such and so much of any of the said Articles as may be necessary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the same from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the said Articles for the necessary Supply of their Garrisons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to prohibit the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majesty's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for

the necessary Use of the Inhabitants of the same respectively: Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Cafe, shall first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they were entered Outwards before the Entry of the same shall be made, and should give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the faid Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majelly's Cultons, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they were so entered out, and for the Purpofes specified and none other; fuch Bond not to be cancelled or delivered up until Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners. fioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Committoners, thewing that the faid Ar icles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were fo entered Outwards:

And His Majelty is hereby further pleafed to order, with the Advice aforefaid, That it shall be lawful for and during the said Term beforementioned, to import into any Port or Place of Great Dritain any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Ti ares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulle; and allo Buils, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef. Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether falted or otherwife; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Veffel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all fuch Articles as aforefaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officer of the Cuftoms at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures in the faid Acts mentioned.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffloners of His Majelty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION FOR PARDONING DE-SERTERS FROM THE MILITIA.

War HEREAS it has been represented to THE KING that there are at this Time many Men, who, having been sworn and enrolled in HIS MAJESTY'S MILITIA FORCES, have made Default, by not appearing and joining their respective Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies when ordered to be embodied, or by deserting or absenting themselves therefrom, and who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of HIS MAJESTY'S GRACIOUS PARDON, and that such an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Instance upon their future Behaviour; HIS MAJESTY has accordingly been graciously pleased to grant HIS FREE PARDON to all MILITIA-MEN having so made Default by not appearing, or by Desertion, or Absence from Duty, who shall return to and join their respective Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies, on or before the 14th Day of July next, or who shall deliver themselves up at the Head-Quarters of any other Regi-

ment, Battalion, Corps, or Independent Company of Militia, or to any Detachment of HIS MA-JESTY's other Forces, or to any Military-Poil, on or before the faid 14th Day of July next, and be from thence marched to their proper Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Com-

pallies.

Any Soldier who may defert from the Militia after thefe HIS MAJESTY's gracious Intentions are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but the be proceeded against with the utmost Severity; as shall also all the said Defaulters, Deferters, and Ablentees who shall not have joined their proper Regiments, Battaliors, Corps, or In-Rependent Companies of Militia, or delivered themiclves up to fome other Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Independent Company of Militia, or to fome Detachment of His Majetty's other Forces, or to fome Military Post, by the faid 14th Day of July

And all Justices of the Peace, Magistrates, Constables, and Peace Officers, and all other Persons whatfoever, are hereby enjoined and required, in pursuance of the Act just passed, " for more spee-" dily completing the Militia of Great Britain;" to apprehend, feize, take, and detain such Defaul-ters. Deserters, and Absentees, for the Purpose of delivering them into fafe Custody at any Military Head Quarters, or into Gaol near to the Place where they shall be apprehended, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law: and all such of the faid Defaulters, Delerters, or Absentees, as were corolled as Substitutes or Volunteers in the Militia, shall, upon being identified before any General, Regimental, or Detachment Court Martial, be forthwith fent to serve in HIS MAJESTY's Regular Forces stationed Abroad, until duly discharged therefrom; and the Person or Persons who shall apprehend and detain any such Defaulter, Deferter, or Absence from the Militia, and deliver him into fafe Cultody as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings over and above the Reward of Twenty Shillings to which such Person or Persons will also be entitled under the Mutiny Act, and shall be paid the same in like Manner as is directed in Respect to the Reward last-mentioned.
