the said Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May last, to promile and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Ivianner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Licutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majelty was graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Ablehodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March last to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefly's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majefly's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the taid Reward was, by Order in Council, prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of April to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majetty's Service, that the faud Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majelly, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this instant June to the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly. PRESENT, The KING's Molt Excellent Majetty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight handred and four, several Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of "Provision without Payment of Dury; to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and " Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" is among other Things, enacted, That certain Acts therein mentioned relating to the Exportation and Importation of Corn, and other Articles of Pro-vision should be, and the same were thereby continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majetty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Acts, is hereby pleafed to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this instant June, until the Thirtieth Day of September next, inclusive, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beel, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, or Butter, unless Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles so to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that nothing contained in this His Majesty's Order shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the laid Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Sullenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Pallengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Vessel, or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesly's Ships of War, or other Ships and Vessels in His Majelty's Service; or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majetty's Forces, Forts, or Garrisons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of such and so much of any of the said Articles as may be necessary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the same from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the said Articles for the necessary Supply of their Garrisons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to prohibit the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majesty's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for
