Donving-Street, June 28, 1803. THE King has been pleased to cause it to be fignified by the Right Honorable Lord Hawkelbury, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to the Ministers of Neutral Powers refiding at this Court, that the necessary Measures having been taken by His Majesty's Command for the Blockade of the Entrance of the River Elbe, in consequence of the forcible Occupation of Parts of the Banks of that River by the French-Troops; the faid River is declared to be in a State of Blockade; and that from this Time all the Measures authorised by the Law of Nations and the respective Treaties between His Majesty and the different Neutral Powers will be adopted and executed with respect to all Vessels which may attempt to violate the faid Blockade. Lord Hawkesbury has been further commanded by His Majelty to fignify to the Ministers of the Neutral Powers, that whenever the French Troops will evacuate the Positions which they now occupy on Parts of the Banks of the Elbe, and will remove to such a Distance from them as to leave the Course of that River perfectly free and fecure to the Veffels of His Subjects, as well as of other Nations, His Majesty will immediately direct His Ships of War which may be stationed at the Mouth of the River Elbe, for the Purpole of blockading the fame, to

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council,

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majerly's Order in Council of the Eleventh Day of May last, prohibiting the transporting into the Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron,

Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for forme Time longer, His Majesty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eleventh Day of July next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or Ship and Lade only of the Articles characteristics. Ship or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts keyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act to enable His Majesty " to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and " more effectually to prevent the Exportation of "Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when pro-"hibited by Proclamation or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be con-strued to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majelly's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on hoard fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time heing; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or

Garrilons, or to His Majelty's Colonics or Flanta-tions in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majelly's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of 'St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided, that upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of Inch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they are for entered Otuwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commiltioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commisfioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necellary Directions herein as to them may respec-W. PROCLAMATION FOR PARDONING DE-SERTERS FROM THE MILITIA.

War Office, June 14, 1803.
WHEREAS it has been represented to THE
KING that there are at Alia The KING that there are at this Time many Men, who, having been fworn and enrolled in HIS MAJESTY'S MILITIA FORCES, have made Default, by not appearing and joining their respective Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies when ordered to be embodied, or by deferting or absenting themselves therefrom, and who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of HIS MAJESTY'S GRACIOUS PARDON, and that fuch an Inflance of His Royal Clemency would have a due Influence upon their future Behaviour; HIS MAJESTY has accordingly been graciously pleased to grant HIS was pleased to receive very graciously:

FREE PARDON to all MIL'TIA-MEN having so made Default by not appearing, or by Defertion, or Absence from Duty, who shall return to and join their respective Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies, on or before the 14th Day of July next, or who shall deliver them-selves up at the Head Quarters of any other Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Independent Company of Militia, or to any Detachment of HIS MA-JESTY's other Forces, or to any Military-Post, on or before the said 14th Day of July next, and be from thence marched to their proper Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or Independent Companies.

Any Soldier who may defert from the Militia after these HIS MAJESTY's gracious Intentions. are made public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but shall be proceeded against with the utmost Severity; as shall also all the said Defaulters, Deferters, and Absentees who shall not have joined their proper Regiments, Battalions, Corps, or In-dependent Companies of Militia, or delivered themselves up to some other Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Independent Company of Militia, or to some Detachment of His Majesty's other Forces, or to fome Military Post, by the faid 14th Day of July

And all Justices of the Peace, Magistrates, Constables, and Peace-Officers, and all other Persons whatfoever, are hereby enjoined and required, in pursuance of the Act just passed, " for more spee-" dily completing the Militia of Great Britain;" to apprehend, seize, take, and detain such Defaulters, Deserters, and Absentees, for the Eurpose of delivering them into fafe Custody at any Military Head-Quarters, or into Gaol near to the Place where they shall be apprehended, in order that they may be dealt with according to Law: and all such of the faid Defaulters, Deletters, or Absentees, as were enrolled as Substitutes or Volunteers in the Militia, shall, upon being identified before any General, Regimental, or Detachment Court Martial, be forthwith fent to serve in HIS MAJESTY's Regular Forces flationed Abroad, until duly difcharged therefrom; and the Perfon.or Perfons who shall apprehend and detain any fuch Defaulter, Deferter, or Absentee from the Militia, and deliver him into fafe Custody as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings over and above the Reward of Twenty Stillings to which tuch Person or Persons will also be entitled under the Mutiny Act, and shall be paid the same in like Manner as is directed in Respect to the Reward last-mentioned.
