T the Court at St. James's, the 22d of June Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended 1803, from the said Thirtieth Day of this instant June 1803,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May last, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-His laid Proclamation, to declare, that all Ablebodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Maiesy was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March lait, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Sea-Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Reward was, by Order in Council, prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of April to the Thirtieth Day of this instant June; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Reward should be conto the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice W. Fawkener. and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act" to continue, until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and sour, several Laws "relating to the prohibiting the Expertation and "permitting the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty; to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this "Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and "Commerce to and from the Ille of Mala." It "Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" It is among other Things, enacted, That certain Acts therein mentioned relating to the Exportation and Importation of Corn, and other Articles of Provision should be, and the same were thereby continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pur-suance of the Powers given by the said Acts, is hereby pleased to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this instant June and the Thirtieth Day of Day of this instant June, until the Thirtieth Day of September next, inclusive, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Share Janks, Swing Back, Broke, News, Articles, Viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Share Janks, Swing Back, Broke, Broke Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether falted or otherwise, or any Bacon, or Butter, unless Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs that the Articles so to be exported as aforesaid are not of British Growth, Protinued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty's duce, or Manusacture; But it is His Majesty's jesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying
