Westminster, July 13, 1803. An Act for raising the Sum of Five Millions, by Loans or Exchequer-Bills, for the Service of Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and three.

An Act for granting to His Majefty certain Du-ties on the Importation of Goods, Wares, and Mer-chandize into, and on Goods, Wares, and Mer-chandize exported from Ircland; and alfo certain Duties of Excife on Spirits and Malt diftilled and made in Ireland.

An A& for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia in Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and three.

An Act to revive and further continue, until the Twenty fifth of March One thousand eight hundred and Four, and amend to much of an Act made in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty as grants certain Allowances to Adjutants and Serjeant-Majors of the Militia of England difembodied, under an Act of the fame Seffion of Parliament.

: An Act to authorife the Advancement of further Sums of Money out of the Confolidated Fund to be applied in the Improvement of the Port of London, by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common-Council alfembled; and to empower the Lords Commilfioners of His Ma-

Lancafter; and for improving the Streets and other Places within the faid Town.
