## St. James's, July 13, 1803.

THE following Addreffes having been prefented to the King; which Addreffes His Majefty was pleafed to receive very graciously:

## Unto the KING's Moft Excellent Majefty.

WE, the Freeholders, Juffices of Peace, and Commiffioners of Supply of Perthshire, at this momentous Crifis present at your Majesty's Throne, our Assurances of zealous and determined Support in the arduous Contest in which the British Empire is engaged :--We well know, that the prefent is no common Warfare :--We know, that we are now contending for our Exiltence as a Nation, and for every Thing that is dear to Britons, or to Men :--We know, that a domineering and arrogant Enemy, after having reduced to Slavery, or fubjected to his Controul many of the Nations of Europe, is exerting every Effort in order to fubdue and deftroy that People whole Spirit and Refources have hitherto, by the Bleffing of Heaven, preferved their Inde-pendence and their Greatnefs, and faved them from gigantic and defolating Ambition. Recent Events have convinced us that every Effort to procure or preferve Amity with France, and the Ruler of France was unavailing; and that that Period which ought to have been the Period of Peace, has been characterized by a Spirit of Hoftility, of Infult, and of Injury to this Country: Every further Conceffion or Relinquishment, it was therefore manifest could answer no other Purpose than to diminish the Power of Refiftance and to facilitate the Means of Deftruction. On the Iffue of the War in which we have been involved (whilft we are neither appalled by the Danger, nor fhrink from the Conteft), we feel and we know depends the Enjoyment of our National Libertics, of our Freedom, of our political, domettic, and individual Happinels. If we fail, (and we can only fail from a Deficiency in Exer-tion,) abject Thraldom and Wretchednels mult be our Portion; but if, under Providence, we are victorious, we shall attain more permanent and honorable Security and Prosperity, than even we, as a Nation, have hitherto enjoyed.

In this arduous Conteft, which affects the Inhabitants of this Country of all Ranks and Defcriptions, and in which all Classes of Men are intereiled, we can affure your Majefty that in this Part of your Dominions the fame Spirit, and the fame Zeal, to avenge the Infults of our menacing and vaunting Foe, animates every Individual. Em-barked, as all now are, in one common Caule of Interest, of Danger, and we trust, of Glory, the Feelings by which all are influenced, are those by which, at this momentous Crisis, Britons ought to be animated, and the Conduct which all are anxious to adopt is fuch, as in the prefent Times Britons ought to purfue. We therefore beg to declare to your Majesty that the Sacrifices and Exertions which your Vigilance and the Wisdom of Parliament have called for, are deemed by us highly ne-

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
