



Pursuant to a Decree of His Majesty's Court of Exchequer at Westminster, made in a Cause *Smith versus Wilson*, the Creditors and Legatees of James Wilson, late of Newington, in the County of Surrey, Linen-Draper, (who died in or about the Month of December 1797,) are forthwith, by their Solicitors, to come in before Abel Moysey, Esq; the Deputy to His Majesty's Remembrancer of the said Court, and prove their Debts and claim their Legacies, or in Default thereof they will be excluded the Benefit of the said Decree.
