enabled to come up with, and to entirely defeat them; to grant His Royal Licence and Authority, that (although the Privilege of bearing Supporters be limited to the Peers of the Realm, the Knights of His Majelty's Orders, and the Proxies of Princes of the Blood Royal at Installations, except in fuch Cafes wherein under particular Circumstances His Majesty has been pleased to grant His especial Licence for the Use thereof,) the faid Charles Vereker may bear for Supporters to his Family Arms, viz.; A Lion, collared, chained, and murally crowned, fupporting His Majefty's Royal Colours, with the Infeription "5th September 1798;" and a Grenadier of the faid Limerick City Militia, fupporting the Regimental Colours; and, as a Motto to the Family Arms of the faid Charles Vereker, the Word "COLOONY," in Memory of the faid gallant and meretorions Action: the faid armorial Diffinctions being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office.

And alfo to order, that this, His Majesty's faid Conceffion, and efpecial Mark of His Royal Favor, be regiltered in His College of Arms.

FRENCH Brig Privateer, Le Courier de Terre Neuve, of Four Guns and Fifty Men, belonging to St. Maloes, was yesterday captured by His Majesty's Ship under my Command, in Lat. 49 Deg. Long. 14 Deg. 30 Min. Wett. She failed fome Days ago from Abreverack, and has not taken any Thing.

SIR, Plantagenet at Sea, July 30, 1803. T Noon on the 27th Inftant, I fell in with AT Noon on the 27th Initant, 1 fell in with His Majeky's Sloop Rofario, in Chace of an Enemy's Veffel. The Rofario, by 4 o'Clock, had gained on the Chace fo as to be much within Gun-Shot, when her Fore-Top-Maft being carried away by the great Prefs of Sail upon it, the dropt 2-ftcrn.

By 8 o'Clock the Plantagenet had got clofc' alongfide the Chace, when the ftruck her Colours. I found her to be the French Ship Privateer L'Atalante, of Bourdeaux, commanded by M. Arnaud Martin, with a Complement of One Hundred and Twenty Men, and pierced for Twenty-two Guns, but having only Fourteen Six Pounders mounted, the Remainder having been thrown overboard during the Chace.

L'Atalante is an exceeding handfome Veffel, coppered, and fails remarkably fait, having run us nearly Nincty Miles in the Eight Hours. She was out Six Days from Bourdeaux, and had taken Nothing. I have the Honor, &c.
