THE following Addreffes having been prefented to the King; which Addreffes His Majefty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly:

To the KING's Moft Exceilent Majefty.

WE, your Majefty's faithful Subjects, the Nobility, Gentry, Clergy, Freeholders, and other Inhabitants of the County of Hereford, animated by the pureft Loyalty and Affection for your Perfon and Government, and roufed by the Dangers of our Country, humbly entreat your gracious Acceptance of this Pledge of our Duty and Attachment. The fudden Recurrence of War, and the poffible

The fudden Recurrence of Wear, and the poffible Renewal of all thole Horrors and Cruelties with which one Man's inordinate Ambition has fo recently afflicted a large Portion of the civilized World, fills us with the moft painful Anxiety. Peace, Sir, is a Bleffing dear to our Hearts; and we were preparing to enjoy its Fruits when the violent Hand of a ferocious Foe dafhed them untafted from our Lips. We regret the fevere Privation, we refent the unjuft Aggreffion, and will endure every Extremity of Diftrefs rather than compromife the fubftantial Interefts, the Honor, and Independence of our Name and Nation.

Permit us, Sir, to express the Share we feel of that Pain which rends your paternal Breaft in contemplating the unnatural Treafons, the atrocious Murders, which a Spirit of Rebellion, maddened by Fanaticifm, has perpetrated in one Part of your Empire. We truft it is the laft Time we shall have to p y fuch gross Delufions, the last your Majefty will have to punish fuch enormous Guilt. Cherishing, ourfelves, a filial Love and Reverence of that Form of Government, which, for a longer Term than can be paralleled in the Annals of the World, secured to our Forefathers the pure Enjoyment of civil Liberty and focial Happinets, we should blush to furvive its Integrity or its Independence. Your Majesty's prudent and vigorous Measures for the Defence and Security of that ancient and venerable Fabric, infpire us with Gratitude and Confidence, and bind us by every Exertion within our Power to ensure, under Divine Providence, their complete Succefs.

Continue then, Sir, to hear unmoved the Calum-

nics and the Threats; and to view without Alarm the extensive Preparations and hoftile Movements of a Military Despot; whilk we, your Majefly's loyal Subjects, meet the Strength and Discipline of his invading Legions with the Spirit of our Silurian Ancestors, resolved, like them, in every Danger which may menace our beloved King and Country, to conquer or to perish in their Defence.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Magistrates, Town-Council, and Inhabitants of the Royal Borough of Wigtown.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Magistrates, Town-Council, and Inhabitants of the Borough of Wigtown, humbly beg Leave to approach your Majesty at this important Crifis with Expressions of our fincere Concern that your Majesty's Endeavours for the Prefervation of Peace have been rendered unfuccessful by the ambitious and iniquitous Views of the French Government.

Imprefied with the deepeft Senfe of the invaluable Bieffings which we enjoy under your Majefty's paternal Government and our happy Confliction, we affure your Majefty of our continued Loyaity and warm Attachment, and of our Readinefs moft zealoufly to concur in and exert our beft Endeavours in Support of fuch Meafures as the Wifdom of your Majefty's Councils shall devife for protecting the Honor and Dignity of your Majefty's Crown, the Safety, and the Independence of the British Empire.
