To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

E, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful Subjects,
the Bishop, and Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Ely, together with the Rest of the Clergy of the Diocese of Ely, request Permisfion humbly to offer to your Majesty our most fincere Expressions of affectionate Zeal for your facred Per-fon and gracious Government at this awful Crisis, when they are each of them infulted and affailed by

malevoient and daring Hostilities.
Impressed with the Urgency of that Danger, which threatens to eradicate every pious and virtuous Principle from the human Mind, to defeat each political Arrangement which tends to promote the Order and Happiness of Society, and which feems particularly directed to the Destruction of our invaluable Constitution both in Church and State, we feel ourselves called upon, in common with our Fellow-Subjects, to avow our Resolution to defend them from so atrociously wicked a Conspiracy, and to offer to our Sovereign and our Country that Tribute of Allegiance and Exertion which is best adapted to our Description and holy Function.
