THE following Address having been presented to the King; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Bishop, and Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Ely, together with the Rest of the Clergy of the Diocese of Ely, request Permission humbly to offer to your Majesty our most sincere Expressions of affectionate Zeal for your sacred Person and gracious Government at this awful Crisis, when they are each of them insulted and assailed by malevolent and daring Hostilities.

Impressed with the Urgency of that Danger, which threatens to eradicate every pious and virtuous Principle from the human Mind, to defeat each political Arrangement which tends to promote the Order and Happiness of Society, and which seems particularly directed to the Destruction of our invaluable Constitution both in Church and State, we feel ourselves called upon, in common with our Fellow-Subjects, to avow our Resolution to defend them from so atrociously wicked a Conspiracy, and to offer to our Sovereign and our Country that Tribute of Allegiance and Exertion which is best adapted to our Description and holy Function.

We had lately indulged a fond Hope, that, after the heavy Pressure of a wasteful and sanguinary War, we might have enjoyed the Blessing of your Majesty's Protection without Annoyance to your Person, or Disturbance to your Government. But since it has pleased the great Disposer of all Events that we should again experience the Evil of unprovoked Insult, and the daring Violation of Right and Truth from our insatiate Foes, we esteem it as well our Interest as our Duty to unite Heart and Hand to repel their Insults, and to secure our Privileges and Properties. May the Almighty grant his Blessing to such patriotic Efforts; and may He long continue us under your Majesty's parental Care.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament the ensuing Session, for an Act to enable the Company of Pro-

prietors of the Ellesmere Canal, to make a Railway or Road, for the Conveyance of Coal, Lime, Stone, Slates, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, from a certain Brook near Ruabon, in the County of Denbigh, through the several Parishes of Ruabon and Llangollen, and the Townships of Bodyllyn, Christionedd Kenrick, and Trevor Issa, in the said County of Denbigh, to the Ellesmere Canal, at or near the North-East End of Pontcysyltee Aqueduct, in the same County; and also to make a Navigable Water Line or Feeder from the said Canal, at or near the said North-East End of the said Pontcysyltee Aqueduct, through the several Parishes of Llangollen and Llandisilio, and the Townships of Trevor Issa, Trevor Ucha, Dinbren, Maes-yr-uchan, and Rysgog, in the said County of Denbigh, to the River Dee, in the Parish of Llandisilio, and in the Townships of Llandisilio and Rhyflog, in the same County, and there to take a Supply of Water out of the said River, for the Purposes of the said Canal, and the Collateral Cuts and Branches thereof; and also to enable the said Company of Proprietors of the Ellesmere Canal, to provide and take a sufficient Quantity of Water out of Bala Pool, otherwise Pimble Mere, in the County of Merioneth, for supplying the said River Dee, in dry Seasons, with an equal or greater Quantity of Water than shall be taken out of the said River, for the Purposes of the said Canal and the Collateral Cuts, and Branches thereof; and for that Purpose to make several Cuts or Feeders near the East or lower End of the said Pool or Mere, in order to convey Water occasionally out of the same into the said River, at a lower Level than that by which the said Water is at present discharged from the said Pool or Mere; and which said several last-mentioned Cuts or Feeders are intended to run through the several Parishes of Llanfawr and Llanuchel, and the Townships of Llanfawr and Bela, in the said County of Merioneth; and also for enabling the said Company of Proprietors to increase the Rates of Tonnage, granted by the several Acts relating to the making of the said Canal and the Collateral Cuts and Branches thereof, upon burnt Lime carried thereon, or on any of the Railways belonging thereto.
