PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majeffy in Council. 7HEREAS, by an Act, paffed in the laft Seilion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight hundred and four, several Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for " allowing the Importation of other Articles of " Provision without Payment of Duty; to the " Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the " bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this "Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and " Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta;" It. is, among other Things, enacted, That certain Acts Therein mentioned, relating to the Exportation and Importation of Corn, and other Articles of Provision should be, and the fame were thereby continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Acts, is hereby pleafed to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this inftant September, until the Thirty-firft Day of December next, inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Veffel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the Following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oken, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, or Butter, unless Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Commilfioners of His Majefty's Cultoms that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majefty's Reafure neverthelefs, that nothing contained in this His Majefty's Order shall extend, or be construed until Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction

AT the Court at St. James's, the 28th of to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and so much of any of the fait A ticles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Mafter, Mariners, Paffengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veffels in His Majefty's Service; or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Forces, Forts. or Garrisons; nor to prolabit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be necessary for the Supply of the British Forts, Callles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have ufually been supplied with the fame from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the neceilary Supply of their Garrifons at St. Helcna, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the faid Company ; nor to prohibit the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Mejelly's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the neceffary Ufe of the Inhabitants of the fame refpectively : Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Cafe, shall first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they were entered Outwards before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and shall give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the faid Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commiflioners of His Majefty's Cufloms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they were fo entered out, and for the Purpofes specified, and none other; fuch Bond not to be cancelled or delivered up
