PRESENT,

The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS, by an Act. paffed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act " to continue, until the First Day of January One " thousand eight hundred and four, feveral Laws " relating to the prohibiting the Exportation and " permitting the Importation of Corn, and for " allowing the Importation of other Articles of " Provision without Payment of Duty; to the " Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods in this " Kingdom; and to the regulating the Trade and " Commerce to and from the Ifle of Malta;" It is, among other Things, enacted, That certain Acts therein mentioned, relating to the Exportation and Importation of Corn, and other Articles of Pro-vision should be, and the same were thereby continued until the First Day of January One thouland eight hundred and four; His Majelty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pur-fuance of the Powers given by the faid Acts, is hereby pleafed to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this instant September, until the Thirty-first Days of Dagember part inclusive no Perfor or Per-Day of December next, inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain any of the following Articles, viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon, or Butter, unlefs Proof shall first be given to the Satisfaction of the Committeners of His Majefty's Cuftoms that the Articles fo to be exported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Pro-duce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majelly's Pleafure nevertheles, that nothing contained in this His Majely's Order shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Arcicles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Vessel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Suffenance, Diet, and Support of the Com-mander, Maîter, Mariners, Passengers, and others on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the necessary

T the Court at St. James's, the 23th of victualling or providing any of His Majely's Ships September 1803, of War, or other Ships and Voffels in His Majefty's Service; or for the necessary vicualling or providing any of His Majefty's Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; nor to provibit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and to much of any of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the fame from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the neceffary Supply of their Garrifons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the neceflary Ufe of the Ships belonging to the faid Company; nor to pro-hibit the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majefty's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the necessary Use of the Inhabitants of the fame refpectively : Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Cafe, shall first make Oath of the true Deftination of the fame to the Places for which they were entered Outwards before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and shall give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the faid Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commillioners of His Majelly's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they were fo entered out, and for the Purpoles specified, and none other; fuch Bond not to be cancelled or delivered up until Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commisfioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners, fuewing that the faid Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were fo entered Outwards : And His Majefly is hereby further p'cafed to

order, with the Advice aforefaid, That it shall be lawfui for and during the faid Term beforemen-tioned, to import into any Port or Place of Great Britain any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, i ares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulle; and allo Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calver, Sheep,
