## A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

**W**HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Third Day of November next: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Third Day of November next to Tuesday the Twenty-second Day of November next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, with the Advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty-second Day of November next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Twenty-second Day of November next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twelfth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and three, in the Forty-third Year of Our Reign.
