·SIR,

SEND herewith an Extract of a Letter from Captain Malbon, of His Majefty's Ship Aurora, giving an Account of his having taken Posseffion of the Islands of St. Pierre and Miquelon, which you will be pleafed to lay before the Lords Commif-fioners of the Admiralty.

Extraß of a Letter from Captain Malbon, command-ing His Majefly's Ship Aurora, to Vice-Admiral Gambier, Commander in Chief at Newfoundland, Sc.

N the 30th June, about Four o'Clock in the Morning, I made the Ifland of Peters; and at Five fent the large Cutter and Launch, manned and armed with a Twelve-Pound Carronade, under the Command of Lieutenant Richard Longfield Davies, and Lieutenant Baillie, of the Marines, to oblige the Town to furrender, on begin the Attack ; between Six and Seven o'Clock they entered the Harbour, under a very thick Fog, and perceiv-ing a Boat croffing from one Side to the other, brought her to, in which they found the Commillary, who acted as Governor. The Confusion that the Place was thrown into from the fudden Attack prevented the Inhabitants from affembling together, and at half-paft Seven the Commiffary furrendered the Island, by delivering the Colours to Lieutenant Davies. From what has been fince learned there is



ino Doubt, that, if the Inhabitants could have had "Time to have collected themfelves from their dif-Ferent Situations, they would have made a ftrong Reliftance, having fince difcovered upwards of One Hundred Stand of Arms among them. Knowing the fmall Force in the Boats, I used my utmost Efforts to get His Majesty's Ship into the Harbour, but was as frequently prevented by thick Fogs. About Eleven, it being somewhat clear, I entered : under a very heavy Prefs of Sail between the Rocks, which were not a Cable's Length acrofs, and at Two P. M. brought to with the best Bower in Fifteen Fathom Water. Found here a French Mer-chant Brig (Le Reines des Anges) and a Schooner (Le Provoyier), with Eleven Imall Schooners, and upwards of One Hundred Battoes. The Island contained Fifh, Stores, Salt, and Merchandize of various Descriptions, and, upon a rough Survey, about Two Hundred and Twenty Men were upon the Island and in the Boats; but they being fo detuched feveral got away in the fmall Craft, One of which, I have fince been informed, was taken off Liverpool in Nova Scotia, and another at St. Lawrence, in Newfoundland.

On every Thing being fecured, I ordered One of the Fifting Schooners to be fitted as a Tender, and having her manned and armed with a Twelve-Pound Carronade, gave the Command to Lieutenant Da-vies, with Directions to fcour the Coaft, and take Poffeffion of the Islands of Great and Little Miquelon, which he did, but no Inhabitants or Stores were found at either of those Places.

Extract of a Letter from Admiral Sir John Colpoys, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majefly's Ships at Plymouth, to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. dated on board the Salvador del Mundo, Hamoaze, 18th

Odober 1803.

I ACQUAINT you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that L'Aventure, French Privateer of Twenty Guns, and One Hundred and Fifty Men, captured by the Acafta, is just arrived. The Prize-Master reports that the Acasta had also retaken the Ship Royal Edward of London, and the Saint Mary's Planter of Liverpool, both from Jamaica, whole late Com-manders are arrived in L'Aventure.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Wolfe, of His Ma-jefty's Ship L'Aigle, to Sir Evan Napean, Bart. duted Downs, Odober 18, 1803.

I HAVE to beg you will acquaint my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, on the 27th Ult. being off Vigo, I captured, after feveral Hours' Chafe, L'Alerte French Brig Privateer, of Fourteen Guns, French Six and Four Pounders, and Eighty four Men, commanded by Bernard Benjamin Bezard, on her Return from a Cruize, having been Sixty-five Days from Bourdeaux. Her Mafts, Sails, and Rigging are much torn by our Shot, and the Man at the Helm (the only Man fuffered on Deck) dangeroufly wounded. I have fent Five wounded Prifoners on Shore, to the Care of the French Conful at Oporto.
