V7 HEREAS Information hath been received VV that an Infectious Diffemper is now raging in the City of New York, in the State of New York, within the United States of America: And whereas by an Act paffed in the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Year of His Majefty's Reign, initialed "An Act for erecting a Lazaret on Chetney "Hill, in the County of Kent, and for reduc-"ing into one Act the Laws relating to Qua-"rantine, and for making further Provition "therein:" It is among other Things cnacted, that it fhall be lawful for His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by His Royal Proclamation, from Time to Time, to de-clare any Infectious Diftemper, the Communica-tion whereof may be highly dangerous to the Health of His Majefty's Subjects, to be of the Nature of the Plague. His Majefty, in purfuance of the faid Power, by York, within the United States of America: And

His Majesty, in purfuance of the faid Power, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, deems it expedient to declare, and doth hereby declare, that the faid Infectious Diftemper is of the Nature of the Plague:

And His Majefty doth therefore hereby order, that all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes now arrived, or which may hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of Great Britain, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man from New York, or any Port within the State of New York, and fhall have cleared out from New York, or any Port within the State of New York, York, or any Port within the State of New York, fubfequent to the Fifteenth Day of August last, (not having any Perfon or Perfons on board the fame actually ill of the faid Fever,) do perform a Quarantine of Fourteen Days at the feveral Places appointed, and according to the Rules preferibed by His Majesly's Order in Council of the Twenty-winth of Luke One theuford which have a Preninth of July One thousand eight hundred, for Per-formance of Quarantine by all Ships and Vef-fels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, and arriving with clean Bills of Health; but in

T the Court at St. James's, the 26th of Oc- | cafe any of the Crew or Pallengers on board any fuch Ship or Veffel which shall have cleared out from New York, or any Port within the State of New York sublequent to the faid Fifteenth Day of August, and shall have arrived, or may hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of Great Britain, or the Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man from New York, or any Port within the State of New York, shall have died of the faid Fever during the Courfe of the Voyage, the Cloaths, and all perfonal Effects which are fulceptible of Infection, worn by, or belonging to fuch Perfon, fhall be forthwith burned, or funk in deep Water; and if fuch Cloaths and Effects fhall not be fo burned or deftroyed, the faid Ship or Veffel, with the Whole of her Cargo, (hall not be permitted to perform Qua-rantine at any Port or Place except at Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port of Place at which the fame has arrived, or fhall arrive as aforefaid, and fhall repair to Standgate Creek, and there perform Quarantine, and not elsewhere: And His Majefly is further pleased to order, with the Advice aforelaid, and it is hereby ordered, that if it shall appear upon the Arrival of any Ship or Vessel from New York or any Port within the State of New York as aforesaid, that any of the Crew or Paffengers belonging to the fame are actually ill of the faid Fever, then fuch Ship or Veffel, and the Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes on board the fame, fhall not be permitted to perform Quarantine at any Port or Place except Standgate Creek, and shall be compelled to depart from any other Port or Place, and to proceed immediately to Standgate Creek in order to perform Quarantine, and shall there per-form Quarantine and not elsewhere : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commifficients of His Ma-jefty's Treafury, the Commifficients of His Ma-jefty's Treafury, the Commifficients for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Bri-tain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter General and the Reft of the Principal Of-ficers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Scoretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Isles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may re-IV, Fawkener.
