The humble Address of the Noblemen, Gentlemen, Clergymen, and Freeholders of the County of Kilkenny.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, beg Leave to address your Majesty in Terms of the sincerest Reverence and Affection; to assure your Majesty of our just Indignation at the recent Outrages which have disgraced our Country, and of our firm Determination to support, with our Lives and Fortunes, your Majesty's Royal Authority, and our present excellent Constitution, confiding in your Majesty's paternal Care, and in the Strength and Loyalty of your faithful Subjects, we bid Defiance to the Efforts of domestic Traitors or foreign Enemies, however desperate or implacable.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most faithful Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Merse and Tiviotlandale, met at Kelfo, on the Twenty-fifth Day of October One thousand eight hundred and three, beg Leave to approach your Throne with renewed Assurances of our ardent Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government.

We lament that your Majesty's earnest and persevering Endeavours to maintain the Peace of your Dominions have been rendered abortive by the insatiable Ambition and implacable Hatred of our Enemies. Reflecting with Grief and Horror on the Desolation and Misery which have marked the Progress of their Armies now concentrated for our Detraction, we consider the present Period the most interesting and awful that has occurred in the Annals of Britain.

Impressed with a Sense of the unrivalled Excellence of our Constitution, confirmed by the pre-eminent and increasing Prosperity of the People, we feel

ourselves impelled by every Motive of Piety and Patriotism, to devote our best Services to its Defence. Encouraged by signal Interpositions of Divine Providence in our Behalf during the late War, and the decided Justice and unavoidable Necessity of that in which we are now engaged, we put our Trust in the God of Battles, the Lord mighty to save, that under his Guidance and Blessing, the Wisdom of your Majesty's Councils, the Unanimity of your People, and the Valour of your Fleets and Armies will speedily vindicate the Honor, and secure the Independence and Peace of the British Empire.

Deeply interested in the Happiness of Mankind, we indulge the pleasing Hope, that the brave Exertions of a free People may be instrumental in breaking the Yoke of oppressed Nations, and overturning that Accumulation of Wickedness and Power which has been so fatal to the Interests of Freedom and Humanity.

Under these Impressions we solemnly engage to exert our personal and professional Influence to cherish and confirm in the Minds of our People, the Sentiments which we have now expressed, and to animate them to Efforts of Activity, Zeal, and Courage adequate to the Magnitude of impending Danger.

That Order may rise out of Confusion, that all the Kingdoms of the Earth may be united under the Prince of Peace, and learn the Art of War no more, and that your Majesty's Government and Example may contribute to these desirable Events, is the earnest Prayer of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal Subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Provincial Synod of Merse and Tiviotlandale.
