My LORB, Demarara, Starbrock, Sept. 20, 1803. HAVE the Honor to acquaint your Lordship of the Surrendon of the Co. which capitulated Yesterday, and this Day we are in Possession.

I take the Opportunity of a Vessel going to Bar-bances to fend this, with the Hope of its reaching your Lordflip fooner than that which Commodore Hood and myfelf shall dispatch as soon as we can convey more Particulars.

HINXING it of the utmost Importance to the Mercantile Interest the earliest Information should be fent, of the Surrender of this Colony, and that of Essequibo, to His Majesty's Forces, I beg Leave to acquaint you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Capi-tulation was signed on board the Heureux Yesterday Morning; in the Evening the Hornet and Netley entered the River, and Two Hundred Troops took Possession of Fort William Frederick, and this Day the Colonies furrendered.

The Hippomenes Ship Corvette of Eighteen Guns, the only Vessel of the Batavian Republic here,

is included in the Capitulation.
