ng to that Colony; but fince December 1799, has been placed under, and confidered as belonging to the Government of Berbice) shall in the fame Manner as proposed by the preceding Article, he ref-pected and conclusive; and Letters of Confirmation (Grondbruren) iffued by Governor and Council here, to the fame complete and indifputable Effect as aforefaid.

Answered in Article X.

The Governor and Council shall Art. XII. have the Power to difpole peremptorily of yet ungranted Lands in any Part of the Colony, for Cultivation, to Perfons that may petition for Grants, on cuftomary Conditions, or otherwife as may be deemed most adapted to promote Agriculture, and of Courle the Profperity of the Colony.

Anfwer.-Cannot be granted.

Art. XIII. During Two Years from this Date it shall be permitted to resident and other Proprietors who with to quit the Colony, or to withdraw their Interest from the fame, to difpofe of their Properties, and to transport or have remitted the Proceeds of it wherever they shall think proper

Answer.—Granted.

Art. XIV. A Detachment of His Britannic Majefty's Forces to take Poffeffion of the Gates of Fort St. Andrew, and of the Battery below the Fort, on Sunday Morning the 25th Instant, at Seven o'Clock.

Answer .- The Forces of His Britannic Majefty to take Polleffion of the Gates of Fort St. Andrew, and all other Posts in the Colony they may think proper to occupy, this Day at Ten o'Clock, or as foon after as possible before Two o'Clock. Art. XV. The Garrison shall march out with the

Honors of War, Horns blowing and Drums beating, and shall carry with them their Arms, Ammunition, and two Field Pieces.

Answer.-The Garrison to march out with the Honors of War, but no Arms, Ammunition, or Field Pieces can be allowed to Priloners of War, except the Officers, who are to retain their Arms.

Art: XVI. The Commandant of the Troops, all the Officers, Soldiers, and other Perfous belong-ing to the Military Department, fent out from Holland to this Colony, and their Wives and Children, shall be embarked within one Month from this Date, and conveyed to the Batavian Republic at the Expence of His Britannic Majesty, and not be Prifon-ers of War; and the Surinam Department having been feat only from that Colony for the Supprefiion of the Mutiny of the Garrifon in this Colony, which took place fome Months ago, shall be conveyed back to Surinam, the Garrifon they belong to, allo within the fame Space of Time, and at His Majelty's Expence, and not to be Prifoners of War.

Answer .- They shall be conveyed to Europe as foon as poffible, but must be confidered as Prifoners of War, and are not to ferve against Great Britain or her Allies, until regularly exchanged.

The Surinam Detachment to be also Prifoners of War, and on the fame Footing as the other Troops; but the Officers of the faid Detachment will be fur nifhed with a Conveyance to Surinam, if they wifh it Art. XVII. A Veffel shall be furnished as foon

as poffible for the Conveyance of the Commandant, his Family, and Officers, and the Baggage and Ef. fects to them belonging.

Anfwer.-Granted.

Art. XVIII. The Sick shall be attended at the Military Hospital at the Expence of His Britannic Majesty, and, when cured, be sent to Holland. Answer.-Granted.

Art. XIX. It shall be permitted to fuch Part of the Military Department as should not wish to return to Europe, to flay in the Colony, and feek for Employment in the Planter Line, or any other Bufinefs their Capacities and Inclinations may fit them for, or, if they choose it, to quit this Colony for any other Place.

Anfwer.-Such People as may be found ufeful to the Colony, on Proof and proper Representation will be allowed to remain.

Art XX. The prefent Government of the Colony, and the Commandant of the Troops shall difpatch immediately the Republican Schoover the Serpent, now in this River, to give advice to the Government of the Republic, of the prefent Capi-tulation. The Naval Officers, Non-committioned Officers, and Seamen shall not be Priloners of War, but depart with the Serpent for the Batavian Republic, and the neceffary Paffports shall be furnished by the Commander of His Britannic Majefty's Naval Forces.

Anfwer .- Cannot be granted, but the fame Veffel that takes our Dispatches to Europe will take their's. The Republican Schooner to be given up to His Majefty's Schooner Netley, at Ten o'Clock this Day.

Art. XXI. The Remainder of the Military Mutineers, who, by their Infurrection from the 11th of April to the 10th of May laft, have put this Colony in Danger of total Deltruction, and are now in Prifon, shall be received in Custody of His Britannic Majefty's Forces, and within One Month from this Date be embarked and fent to the Batavian Republic at His Britannic Majesty's Expence, to be tried for their high Crimes, and receive the merited Punifhment.

Answer - The British do not protect Mutineers any Country. The Disposal of them to be left of any Country. to the Commanders in Chief of His Britannic Majefty's Forces in the Weft Indies.

Art. XXII. Should hereafter any Differences arile concerning the true Meaning of any of the Articles of the prefent Capitulation, the Interpretation of the fame shall be always given in Favor of the Colonifts.

Anfwer.—Granted.
