Copy of a Letter from Mr. Gunthorps, Commander of the Badger Excife Cutter, to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. dated the 12th Inflant.

Beg Leave to acquaint you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that being in Lowestoffe Roads Yesterday Afternoon with the Cutter under myiCommand, I received Intelligence from the Commander of His Majesty's Gun-Brig Censor, that he had seen a Privateer in the Offing in the Act of Boarding a Vessel; in consequence of which Information I immediately weighed, and went in Pursuit of her; and at Eleven this Morning captured, after a Chase of Three Hours, (during which Time she had nearly escaped, owing to a very thick Fog coming on,) Le Vigilant French Cutter Privateer, burthen about Fifty Tons, belonging to Dunkirk, Citizen Jean Winnor Vanderwalle, Commander, manned with Thirty sive Men, and had only One Swivel on board, besides small Arms. She sailed from Ostend Yesterday Morning, and had not taken any Thing.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

TRANSLATION of a Publication by which the Royal Department of Customs at Copenhagen informs all Navigators, that from the 1st Day of January 1804, a new Light House will be lighted at a Place called Agnæs Pynten, near Drontheim in Norway.

POR the Safety of Vessels sailing to or from Drontheim, a Light-House, with Lanthorns, has been erected upon Agnas Pynten, which will in suture remain lighted every Year from the 1st of September to the 15th of April inclusive, from Half an Hour after Sunset to Sunrise:—It will be lighted for the first Time on the 1st January 1804.

This Lanchorn having a Circle round it painted Red, is placed on the Northernmost Point of Agnas Pyuten, at an Elevation of about Sixty Feet from the Surface of the Water, a little to the Eastward of the small Bay, where the Farm named d'Agnas is fituated, and at not more than Six Hundred Ells Distance from the said Farm.

Ring fluen, the most dangerous Rock to the Eastward of Agnas Pynten, is about Two Hundred Fathoms to the E. half S. of the Light. And Greafefluen, or the Rock to the Westward of Lynas Pynten, is fituated, as also the Church of Oclandi to the N. and by W. of the Light, at precifely Three Hundred and Sixty Ells from it.

The Island of Garten is to the W. N. W. and the Seignorial Land of OEsterraad to the R. N. E. of

the Light.
