SIR,

Beg Leave to acquaint you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that being in Loweltoffe Roads Yekerday After-noon with the Cutter under myjCommand, I received Intelligence from the Commander of His Majelty's Gun Brig Cenfor, that he had feen a Privateer in the Offing in the Act of Boarding a Veffel; in confequence of which Information I immediately weighed, and went in Purfuit of her; and at Eleven this Morning captured, after a Chafe of Three Hours, (during which Time fhe had nearly elcaped, owing to a very thick Fog coming on,) Le Vigilant French Cutter Privateer, burthen about Fifty Tons, belonging to Dunkirk, Citizen Jean Winnor Van-derwalle, Commander, manned with Thirty-five Men, and had only One Swivel on board, befides She failed from Oftend Yefterday fmall Arms.
