SIR, I BEG to make known to you, that this Day, at Four P. M. Loweftoffe bearing N. W. Diftance Eight Leagues, His Majefty's Gun-Brig under my Command; captured Le Lionnais French Cutter Privateer, Jean Joley, Commander, of Twenty-one Tons Burthen, mounting 'I'wo Carriage Guns, with fmall Arms, and a Complement of Twenty-one Men, out Four Days, but had not made any Capture.

On removing the Crew I found the Veilel in fo bad a State, with every Appearance of blowin Weather, that I deemed it prudent to defroy her. with every Appearance cf blowing

SIR. 7 HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that, cruif. I jug off Calais, agreeable to my Orders from Rear-Admiral Montagu, I this Morning, at Daylight, chafed a Lugger, and at Noon came up with and captured the French National Gur-Boat No. +36, mounting One Brafs Eighteen Pounder Forward, and a Howitzer Abaft, commanded by Lewis Sautoin, Enfign de Vaiffeau, with Seven Sailors and a Captain, and Twenty-feven Soldiers of the 36th Regiment of the Line. She failed the Day before from Dunkirk for Boulogne.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

TRANSLATION of a Publication by which the Royal Department of Cufloms at Copenhagen informs all Navigators, that from the 1/t Day of January 1804, a new Light House will be lighted at a Place culled Aguas Pynten, near Drontheim in Norway.

TOR the Safety of Veffels failing to or from Drontheim, a Light-Houle, with Lanthorns, has been erected upon Agnes Pynten, which will in future remain lighted every Year from the Eff of September to the 15th of April inclusive, from Half an Hour after Sunfet to Sunrife :---- it will be lighted for the first Time on the 1st January 1805.

This Lanthorn having a Circle round it painted Red, is placed on the Northernmoft Point of Agnas Punten at an Elevation of about Sinty Feet from the Surface of the Water, a little to the Earlward I

Initant, captured the French Lugger Privateer Le | of the fmall Bay, where the Farm named d'Agnas is fituated, and at not more than Six Hundred Ells Distance from the faid Farm.

Ring fluen, the most dangerous Rock to the East-ward of Agnas Pynten, is about Two Hundred Fa-thoms to the E. half S. of the Light. And Graafefluen, or the Rock to the Westward of Agnas Pynten, is fituated, as also the Church of Oelands to the N. and by W. of the Light, at precifely Three Hundred and Sixty Ells from it.

The Island of Garten is to the W. N. W. and the Seignorial Land of OEserraad to the N. N. E. of the Light.

So that Veffels coming from the Weftward, and making for Drontheim, have the Island of Garter. on their North, and are certain of feeing the Light-Houfe of Agnæs, and may then fleer their Courie for the Entrance until the Light-House is on their South by the Compass, when they are to tack to-wards the Light, and fail direct for Land until within Thirty Fathoms of it ;--they mult then keep along Shore in order to pais with Safety the Ringfluen or Rock to the Eastward, which is fituated at from One Hundred and Twenty to One Hundred and Thirty Fathoms to the N. E. half E. from the North of the Point.

Veffels failing from East to Welt may, when the Light-House is upon their Welt half South, fafely tack, and purfue a ilraight Courfe.

When the Wind is contrary and Veffels are in Sight of the Light-House, (fo long as the Weather will permit their failing, and that the Fog or Snow do not prevent them from feeing the Light Houfe,) they may fail, on tacking to and fro, in perfect Safety till Daylight appears.
