The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange under a limited Sum, in England; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Man, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" It is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provisions without Payment of Duty, to continue in force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament; which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be, and the same is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers given by the said Acts, is hereby pleased to order, That, from the Thir-

tieth Day of this instant December, until the Thirty-first Day of March next, inclusive, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain, any of the following Articles; viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether salted or otherwise, or any Bacon or Butter, unless Proof shall first be given, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the Articles so to be exported as aforesaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that nothing contained in this His Majesty's Order shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of such and so much of any of the said Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Vessel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Sustainance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Passengers, and others on board such Ship or Vessel, or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Vessels in His Majesty's Service; or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Forces, Forts, or Garrisons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of such and so much of any of the said Articles as may be necessary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the same from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the said Articles for the necessary Supply of their Garrisons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the said Company; nor to prohibit the Exportation of any of the said Articles to the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majesty's Colonies.

Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the necessary Use of the Inhabitants of the same respectively: Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Case, shall first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Place for which they were entered Outwards before the Entry of the same shall be made, and shall give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the said Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they were so entered out, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; such Bond not to be cancelled or delivered up until Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were so entered Outwards:

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, with the Advice aforesaid, That it shall be lawful for and during the said Term beforementioned, to import into any Port or Place of Great Britain any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwise; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures in the said Acts mentioned.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty, by an Act passed in the Forty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to regulate the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until the signing a Definitive Treaty of

Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, and to declare the Isle of Malta to be Part of Europe:" His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieth of July One thousand eight hundred and one, to order and declare, That the Port of La Valette, in the said Island of Malta, should be taken to be, and the same was thereby made a free Port, for the Importation into, and Exportation from the same of all Sorts of Goods and Merchandizes in trading Ships or Vessels belonging to Subjects of States in Amity with His Majesty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatever Manner such Ships or Vessels should be navigated, and should continue to be such free Port until the signing a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, unless His Majesty should, in the mean Time otherwise order; subject nevertheless to such Regulations for the Security of the Possession of the Island of Malta and its Dependencies, and the Protection of the Health of the Garrison, and Inhabitants thereof, as might be then in force, or should from Time to Time be deemed necessary or expedient in that Behalf; and that the same Drawbacks and Bounties, and upon the same Terms and Conditions which then were, or thereafter might be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of any Goods and Merchandizes to the Island of Minorca or to Gibraltar, should, and might be allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandizes to the Port of La Valette, in the said Island of Malta; which said Order, by an Order made, by His Majesty in Council, of the Eighth of June One Thousand eight hundred and three, under the Authority of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, was further continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four: And whereas, by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange, under a limited Sum, in England; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That the said above-recited Act, made in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, which, by an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, was

continued until the First Day of January One thousand Eight hundred and four, shall be, and the same is thereby further continued until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Orders made by His Majesty in Council on the Thirtieth of July One thousand eight hundred and one, and on the Eighth of June One thousand eight hundred and three, for regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Island of Malta, shall be continued and be in force until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, unless His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, shall think fit otherwise to order and direct: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

JOSEPH CHILDS, of Liskeard, in the County of Cornwall, Gentleman, having this Day presented his Petition to the House of Commons, setting forth,

That your Petitioner is an Inhabitant of the Borough of Liskeard, in the County of Cornwall, pay-

ing, or liable to pay, Scot and Lot there: That on the Sixth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and two, an Election of Burgesses to serve in Parliament for the Borough of Liskeard was duly had: That, at the said Election, the Honorable John Eliot and the Honorable William Eliot, Thomas Sheridan, Esq; and William Ogilvie, Esq; were Candidates to serve in Parliament for the said Borough: That the Returning Officer of the said Borough afterwards, upon the said Election, returned that the said John Eliot and William Eliot were duly elected to serve in Parliament for the said Borough: That, against the said Return, Two Petitions were afterwards duly presented to this Honorable House, one on the Part of certain Inhabitants of the said Borough, the other on the Part of the said Thomas Sheridan, Esq; and William Ogilvie, Esq; complaining of the said Return: That thereupon a Select Committee of this Honorable House was afterwards duly struck, and sworn well and truly to try the Matters of the said Petitions; and which said Select Committee, on the Twenty-sixth Day of February, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and three, duly met for the Purpose of trying and determining the same: That it appeared to the said Select Committee on the Hearing and Trial of the said Petitions, that the Merits of the said Petitions did depend on the Right of Election, therefore the said Committee did require the Counsel for the several Parties to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committee Statements in Writing of the Right of Election for which they respectively contended: That, in consequence thereof, the Counsel for the Petitioners, Thomas Sheridan, Esq; and William Ogilvie, Esq; and also for the other Petitioners before-mentioned, delivered in a Statement, stating the Right of Election for Burgesses to serve in Parliament for the said Borough, to be in the Inhabitants paying, or liable to pay, Scot and Lot: That the Counsel for the Sitting Members, the Honorable John Eliot and William Eliot, delivered in a Statement, stating that the Right of Election of Burgesses to serve in Parliament for the said Borough, was in the Mayor and Burgesses of the said Borough: That afterwards, namely, on or about the Ninth Day of March, the said Select Committee did determine, that the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement of the said Petitioners, was not the Right of Election for the Borough of Liskeard, in the County of Cornwall: That, upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Members, the Select Committee did determine, that the Right of Election, as set forth in that Statement, was the Right of Election for the said Borough of Liskeard, which said Resolutions or Determinations were afterwards, on the Tenth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and three, duly reported to this Honorable House, and by this Honorable House ordered to be entered in the Journals thereof:

That your Petitioner, with all Deference to the said Determinations of the said Select Committee, humbly conceives that the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Members, and as determined by the said Select Committee as aforesaid, is not the Right of Election for the said Borough of Liskeard, but that the Right of Election, as set forth

in the said Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the said Thomas Sheridan, Esq; and William Ogilvie, Esq; and for the several other Petitioners before-mentioned, is the legal Right of Election for Burgeses to serve in the said Borough:

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays, that this Honorable House will admit him as a Party to oppose that Right of Election that has been deemed valid in the Judgment of the said Select Committee as aforesaid; and that this Honorable House will appoint as early a Day as possible to take the Premises into Consideration, and grant him such other Relief as to this Honorable House shall seem meet, &c.

I do hereby give Notice, that the House has appointed Tuesday the Tenth Day of April next at Three of the Clock in the Afternoon, to take the said Petition into Consideration.

TRANSLATION of a Publication by which the Royal Department of Customs at Copenhagen informs all Navigators, that from the 1<sup>st</sup> Day of January 1804, a new Light House will be lighted at a Place called Agnes Pynten, near Drontheim in Norway.

FOR the Safety of Vessels failing to or from Drontheim, a Light-House, with Lanthorns, has been erected upon Agnes Pynten, which will in future remain lighted every Year from the 1<sup>st</sup> of September to the 15<sup>th</sup> of April inclusive, from Half an Hour after Sunset to Sunrise:—It will be lighted for the first Time on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 1804.

This Lanthorn having a Circle round it painted Red, is placed on the Northernmost Point of Agnes Pynten, at an Elevation of about Sixty Feet from the Surface of the Water, a little to the Eastward of the small Bay, where the Farm named d' Agnes is situated, and at not more than Six Hundred Ells Distance from the said Farm.

Ring fluen, the most dangerous Rock to the Eastward of Agnes Pynten, is about Two Hundred Fathoms to the E. half S. of the Light. And Graasefluen, or the Rock to the Westward of Agnes Pynten, is situated, as also the Church of Oelands to the N. and by W. of the Light, at precisely Three Hundred and Sixty Ells from it.

The Island of Garten is to the W. N. W. and the Seigniorial Land of Oesterraad to the N. N. E. of the Light.



So that Vessels coming from the Westward, and making for Drontheim, have the Island of Garten on their North, and are certain of seeing the Light-House of Agnæs, and may then steer their Course for the Entrance until the Light-House is on their South by the Compass, when they are to tack towards the Light, and sail direct for Land until within Thirty Fathoms of it;—they must then keep along Shore in order to pass with Safety the Ring-fluon or Rock to the Eastward, which is situated at from One Hundred and Twenty to One Hundred and Thirty Fathoms to the N. E. half E. from the North of the Point.

Vessels sailing from East to West may, when the Light-House is upon their West half South, safely tack, and pursue a straight Course.

When the Wind is contrary and Vessels are in Sight of the Light-House, (so long as the Weather will permit their sailing, and that the Fog or Snow do not prevent them from seeing the Light-House,) they may fail, on tacking to and fro, in perfect Safety till Daylight appears.
