P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS, by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange under a limited Sum, in England; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce, to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace;" It is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provisions without Payment of Duty, to continue in force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament; which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be, and the same is thereby, further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance of the Powers given by the said Acts, is hereby pleased to order, That, from the Thirtieth Day of this instant December, until the Thirtieth Day of March next, inclusive, no Person or Persons whatsoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain, any of the following Articles; viz. Bulls, Cows, Oxen

Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether salted or otherwise, or any Bacon or Butter, unless Proof shall first be given, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the Articles so to be exported as aforesaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that nothing contained in this His Majesty's Order shall extend, or be construed to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of such and so much of any of the said Articles as shall be necessary to be carried in any Ship or Vessel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Sustenance, Diet, and Support of the Commander, Master, Mariners, Passengers, and others on board such Ship or Vessel, or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Vessels in His Majesty's Service; or for the necessary victualling or providing any of His Majesty's Forces, Forts, or Garrisons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of such and so much of any of the said Articles as may be necessary for the Supply of the British Forts, Castles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the same from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the said Articles for the necessary Supply of their Garrisons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Use of the Ships belonging to the said Company; nor to prohibit the Exportation of any of the said Articles to the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majesty's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the necessary Use of the Inhabitants of the same respectively: Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Case, shall first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Place for which they were entered Outwards before the Entry of the same shall be made, and shall give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the said Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they were so entered out, and for the Purposes specified, and none other;

such Bond not to be cancelled or delivered up until Proof shall be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were so entered Outwards :

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, with the Advice aforesaid, That it shall be lawful for and during the said Term beforementioned, to import into any Port or Place of Great Britain any Beans called Kidney or French Beans, Tares, Lentiles, Calavancies, and all other Sorts of Pulse ; and also Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Calves, Sheep, Lambs, and Swine ; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether salted or otherwise ; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheese, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever ; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Officers of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forfeitures in the said Acts mentioned. — And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS in virtue of the Powers vested in His Majesty, by an Act passed in the Forty-first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to regulate the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until the signing a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, and to declare the Isle of Malta to be Part of Europe :—" His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirtieth of July One thousand eight hundred and one, to order and declare, That the Port of La Valette, in the said Island of Malta, should be taken to be, and the same was thereby made a free Port, for the Importation into, and Exportation from the same of all Sorts of Goods and Merchandizes in trading Ships or Vessels belonging to Subjects of States in Amity with His Majesty, of whatever Burthen, or in whatever Manner such Ships or Vessels should be navigated, and should continue to be such free Port until the signing a Definitive Treaty of Peace, and from thence until Six Weeks after the next Meeting of Parliament, unless His Majesty should, in the mean Time otherwise order ; subject nevertheless to such Regulations for the Security of the Possession of the Island of Malta and its Dependencies, and the Protection of the Health of the Garrison, and In-

habitants thereof, as might be then in force, or should from Time to Time be deemed necessary or expedient in that Behalf ; and that the same Drawbacks and Bounties, and upon the same Terms and Conditions which then were, or thereafter might be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of any Goods and Merchandizes to the Island of Minorca or to Gibraltar, should, and might be allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods and Merchandizes to the Port of La Valette, in the said Island of Malta ; which said Order, by an Order made, by His Majesty in Council, of the Eighth of June One Thousand eight hundred and three, under the Authority of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, was further continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four : And whereas, by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue several Laws relating to the suspending the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty for restraining the Negotiation of Promissory Notes and Bills of Exchange, under a limited Sum, in England ; and to the prohibiting the Exportation from, and permitting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, until the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and five ; and to the regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Isle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That the said above-recited Act, made in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, which, by an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, was continued until the First Day of January One thousand Eight hundred and four, shall be, and the same is thereby further continued until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Orders made by His Majesty in Council on the Thirtieth of July One thousand eight hundred and one, and on the Eighth of June One thousand eight hundred and three, for regulating the Trade and Commerce to and from the Island of Malta, shall be continued and be in force until Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, unless His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, shall think fit otherwise to order and direct : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

S I R,

**I** ENCLOSE, for their Lordships' Information, a Copy of a Letter which I have received from Lieutenant Young, commanding His Majesty's

Hired Lugger Speculator, acquainting me of his having attacked and driven on Shore Four of the Enemy's Gun-Boats, with Troops on board, apparently proceeding from Dunkirk to Calais.

MY LORD,

I BEG Leave to inform you, in cruising in His Majesty's Armed Lugger Speculator, under my Command, and by the Directions of Captain Stewart to cruise off Dunkirk, the Morning of the 19th Instant, Gravelines then bearing East by South, Distance Four or Five Miles, I saw Four Gun-Boats full of Troops, running along Shore, which I supposed bound to Calais, at Ten A. M. I got very close to them, and at Half past Ten I had the Satisfaction to drive all Four of them on Shore, although the Enemy opened a Fire from Six long Four-Pounders on the Shore; Two of the Gun-Boats must have been wrecked, as the Sea made a Break over them, the other Two got off, as I supposed; I am happy to say they never hulled us.

*The Honorable Admiral Cornwallis has transmitted to this Office a Letter from Captain Winthrop, of His Majesty's Ship the Ardent, to Captain Sir Edward Pellew, of the Tonnant, dated 29th November 1803, of which the following is a Copy :*

SIR,

THE Ship chased from the Squadron Yesterday by His Majesty's Ship under my Command, I closed with off Cape Finisterre, so near as to be able to give her a few Shot, and should have been alongside of her in a few Minutes had not the Wind headed me off Shore, which enabled her to double the Cape, and get into Finisterre-Bay, where she ran on Shore; from Apprehension of our sending to take Possession of her, and at Midnight blew up.

She proved to be the Bayonnaise French National Frigate, of Thirty-two Guns and Two Hundred Men, from the Havannah bound to Ferrol.
