PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council.

WHEREAS, by an Act, paffed in the pre-fent Selfion of Parliament, intituled "An "Act to continue feveral Laws relating to the " fulpending the Operation of Two Acts of the ٤¢ Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of " His prefent Majelly, for rellraining the Negotia-"tion of Promiflory Notes and Bills of Exchange "under 2 limited Sum, in England; and to the "prohibiting the Exportation from, and permit-" ting the Importation to, Great Britain, of Corn, " and for allowing the Importation of other Ar-" ticles of Provision without Payment of Duty, " and the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thou-⁵⁶ fand eight hundred and five; and to the regu ¹⁶ lating the Trade and Commerce, to and from the " Ifle of Malta, until Six Months after the Ratifi-" cation of a Definitive Trenty of Peace;" It is, among other Things, enacted, That an Act, made in the Thirty-ninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majeity, intituled An Act for enabling His Majeity to prohibit the Exportation and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provisions without Payment of Duty, to continue in force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament; which was continued by an Act of the Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, and amended and further con-tinued by feveral fubfequent Acts until the Firft Day of January One thousand eight hundred and four, shall be, and the fame is thereby, further con-tinued until the Twenty fifth Day of March One thousand eight handred and five; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, and in purfuance of the Powers given by the faid Acts, is hereby pleafed to order, That, from the Thir-tieth Day of this inflant December, until the Thirty-first Day of March next, inclusive, no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever shall export, or shall load or lay on board any Ship or Vessel, with the Intent to export from any Port or Place of Great Britain, any ł of the following Articles; viz. Bulls, Cows, Onen

A T the Court at St. James's, the 21ft of Calves, Sheep, Lambs, Swine, Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, or Lamb, whether falted or otherwife, or any Bacon or Butter, unlefs Proof fhall first be given, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, that the Articles fo to be ex-ported as aforefaid are not of British Growth, Produce, or Manufacture; But it is His Majefty's Pleafure neverthelefs, that nothing contained in this His Majelt;'s Order shall extend, or be construct to extend, to prevent the Exportation or carrying out of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Ar-ticles as fhall be neceffary to be carried in any Ship or Veffel, on its Voyage out and Home, for the Suftenance, Diet, and Support of the Com-mander, Mafter, Mariners, Paifengers, and others on board furth Ship or Veffel, or for the user for on board fuch Ship or Veffel, or for the neceffary victualling or providing any of 11is Majefty's Ships of War, or other Ships and Veffels in His Majefty's Service; or for the necellary victualling or providing any of His Majefty's Forces, Forts, or Garrifons; nor to prohibit, at any Time, the Exportation of fuch and fo much of any of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Supply of the British Forts, Callles, or Factories in Africa, or of British Ships trading upon that Coast, which have usually been supplied with the fame from Great Britain; nor to prohibit the Exportation by the East India Company, or any Agent employed by them, of any of the faid Articles for the necessary Supply of their Garrifons at St. Helena, Bombay, and Bencoolen, or for the necessary Ule of the Ships belonging to the faid Company ; nor to pro-hibit the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to the Islands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man; or to any of His Majesty's Colonies, Islands, or Plantations in America or the West Indies; or to the Town or Port of Gibraltar, for the neceffary Uie of the Inhabitants of the fame refpectively : Provided that the Merchant Exporter, in each Cale, shall sinft make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Place for which they were entered Outwards before the Entry of the fame fhall be made, and shall give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, in treble the Value of the faid Articles, to the Satisfaction of the Commillioners of His Majefty's Cultoms, to carry the faid Articles to the Places for which they were fo entered out, and for the Parpoles specified, and none other:
