As feveral Artificers and Manufadurers, Subjects of Is feveral Artificers and Manufalauers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms, the follow-ing Abstrads of Adds of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His prefent Majesty, for preventing such Pradices, are published, for the Information of all Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them : And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to these who are by Dipoletation to when. That is only be objected, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to thefe who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufasturers cut of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools of ' Infruments used by them, as well as to the Artic cers or Manufacturers themfolves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folding any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brad, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-m. cer, o. any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Formers Countries out of the King's Dominions, and in ... be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Inferior tion in any of the Courts at Weitminster, an ar

the Affizes or Quarter Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Diferetion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fhall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaflador, Minister, or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambaflador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Persons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of eing an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devife, or Purchase, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made, upon Oath, before any Juffice of Peace, that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted or is preparing to go out of His Majelty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid, fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of One Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted, upon Indictment, of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas, for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall rive fuch Security to the King not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as inch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be prefecuted in the Court of Justiciary or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George IL Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton, or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer is any other of the Manufsctures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland into any Foreign Country not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted, upon Indictment or Information, in the Kings Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by

Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall be convicted for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in cafe of a fublequest Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on board any Ship or Boat, not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up, or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall, for every Offence, forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Ession, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majesty's Warehouses, all fuch Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on board any Vessel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publicly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on boardhis Veffel, he fhail, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and, if the Veffel belongs to His Majetty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but fhall alfo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majetty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain or of the Revenue iu Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Molety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Molety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

Statutes 14, 21, 25, and 26 of His prefent Majefly. BY these Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above-mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil, or Implement whatfover, uled in or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Steel, or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof ; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffeffion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above-mentioned, in the cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.

Efg; ran to the Spot, and found there the faid William Holmes lying on the Ground dangeroufly wounded; and the faid William Holmes bath deposed, that feeing two Men, one in a

Blue Jacket, the other in a Smock-Froek, he rode up to the Man in a Jacket, and endeavoured to fecure him, on which the Man immediately fired at him, and then, with Holmes ; and it appearing that the faid Willium Thorn-ton that Evening bough Powder and Shot at Retford ; and neither Smith nor Thorn're having fuce been form or beard of in the Neighbourhood where they refided, firongly authorize the Sufficient that they were Parties in the Perpetration of the Airocity;
