SIR,

Herewith transmit, for the Information of the Lords Commillioners of the Admiralty, Two Letters from Captain Rofs, of His Majefty's Ship Defirée, relative to Veffels captured and deffroyed. I am, &c. J. T. DUCKWORTH.

SIR, Defirée, Mancinelle, 19th Aug. 1803. HAVING fetched into this Anchorage last Evening, and feeing from the Mast-Head, over the Land, several Vessels at Anchor in Monte Chrifte Roads, I dispatched the Boats armed, under Lieutenant Canning, of His Majefty's Ship I command, to bring them out, which Service he performed with Credit, under a heavy Fire from the Batteries, and returned at Daylight this Morning, with Five Schooners and a Sloop.

Copy of a Letter from Captain William Sciby, Commander of His Majefly's Ship the Cerberus, to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. duted at Spithead, the 26th Inflant. SIR,

BEG you will be pleafed to lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the enclosed Copy of a Letter written to Rear-Admiral Sir James Saumarez, flating my having captured, in His Majefty's Ships under my Command, the National Gun .

Veffel Le Chameau, and deftroyed another off Cape La Hague, on the Night of the 25th Inftant. W. SELBY. I am, &c.

His Majefly's Ship Cerberus, off Cape La SIR, Hague, 2616 January, 1804. N purfuance of your Orders, I Yelterday at One P. M. weighed in His Majefly's Ship Cerberus, under my Command, from Guernley Roads, and having paffed through the Little Ruffel, I shaped a Courle for Cape la Hague, in order, if possible, to look into Cherbourgh before dark ; in our Approach to the above Cape, we discovered a Convoy of the Enemy, confifting of Four armed Veffels, fteering to the Eaftward. We had the good Fortune to cut them off before they reached the Cape, which obliged them to anchor. The Strength of the Tide prexented our reaching them. I therefore hauled the Wind to the Southward,

under a Prefs of Sail, until after dark, when we bore up for Cape la Hague, and at Midnight faw them coming round the Cape, but fo clofe to the Land that it was confidered dangerous to take the Ship near them. However, a heavy Squall of Wind driving them a little further from the Shore, we fucceeded in capturing the National Gun Veffel Le Chameau, and driving one on the Rocks, the reft effected their Escape, owing to the Vicinity of the Rocks, which at that Time was not more than a Cable's length from us.
