#### ZOUCHE BARGONY.

The Heir at Law, or other Lineal Descendants, (if any such there be,) of the Body of MARY ZOUCHE, Second Daughter of EDWARD, last Lord ZOUCHE.

THE said Mary Zouche was in the Year 1603, married at Hanbury, in the County of Worcester, to Thomas Leighton, Esq; Son and Heir Apparent of Sir Thomas Leighton, Knight, Governor of Guernsey and Jersey.

The said Thomas Leighton had Issue, Edward and Three younger Sons, Thomas, William, and Charles, of which said younger Sons there is nothing known, with certainty, beyond the Register of their Births; but it is believed that William was afterwards Knighted, as the Register of Hanbury furnishes an Entry of the Burial of a Son Charles in 1653, and the Birth of a Daughter Elizabeth in 1655, Children of a Sir William Leighton, Knight.

Edward Leighton, the eldest Son of the said Sir Thomas Leighton, was married to Mary Stanicy, in 1624, by whom he had Issue Two Sons and Three Daughters, Thomas and Edward, Mary, Barbara, and Elizabeth, besides a Son Henry, who died an Infant, of which Five Children nothing has yet been found, except the Register of their Births.
