'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Majefty, intituled " An Act for regulating the Trade 66 between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies · 66 and Plantations in North America and in the West " India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the " United States of America, and between-His Ma-" jesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in " the West Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it stall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or, by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorife, in Case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then ensuing Seaion only; provided always that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall anot be imported except in Conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be speeified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's "Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And · whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants or Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the enfuing Season with Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy -Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the

T the Court at St. James's, the 1st of Fe- | Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpole a Licence thall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorifed in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter-mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majelty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vestel, to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Vessel at the Port, Har bour, or Place in the Island of Newfoundland. where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Peace, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned.; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is

hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Vessel, of his having received the faid Licence fo indorfed as before-directed, and to transinit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom W. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HERFAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the infectious Distemper which some Time since raged in the City of New York, in the State of New York; at Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania; and at Alexandria, in the State of Virginia, within the United States of America, has totally cealed; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraint upon Trade, so far as may be confistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Orders in Council of the Twenty-fixth October and Twenty-third November last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes which, subsequent to the First Day of July preceding, should have cleared out from any of the Ports in the States of New York, Pen-Sylvania, or Virginia, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports in the States of New York, Pensylvania, or Virginia, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Orders of the Twenty-fixth October and Twenty-third of November last had not been made, any Thing in the faid Orders contained to the contrary notwithstanding; provided such Ships and Vessels shall have sailed from the Ports in the States of New York, Pensylvania, or Virginia, subsequent to the First Day of December lait, and that none of the Crew or other Perfons on board shall have died, or been sick with the faid Fever, during the Course of the Voyage: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieuteuant-General, and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respec-tive Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
