'The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twentyeighth Year of the Reign of His present Ma-estly, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies 44 and Plantations in North America and in the West 41 India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the
42 United States of America, and between His Ma-" jesty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Islands in "the West Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted. That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or, by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorife, in Case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then ensuing Sea-Son only; provided always that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newsoundland, shall not be imported except in Conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be spe-chied in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants or Fishermen of the Island of Newsoundland for the enfuing Scason with Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within

of fuch Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence shall have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorised in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinaster mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel, to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the Island of Newsoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Peale, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newson d and is hereby enjoined and required to give a Cartificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, of his having received the faid Licence fo inderfed as before-directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Eng. land or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the infectious Distemper which some Time since raged in the City of New York, in the State of New York; at Philipping State of New Y ladelphia, in the State of Penfylvania; and at Alexandria, in the State of Virginia, within the United States of America, has totally ceased; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being de-sirous to remove all Restraint upon Trade, so sar as may be confishent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleafed, by and with the Acrice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Orders in Council of the Twenty-fixth October and Twenty-third November last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes which, subsequent to the First Day
