P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America. and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to authorise, or, by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland for the Time being to authorise, in Case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock from any of the Territories belonging to the said United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then ensuing Season only; provided always that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, so authorised to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported except in Conformity to such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants or Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season with Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock may be imported into the said Island from any of the Territories belonging to the said United States by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within

the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of such Importation, have cleared out from some Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or other His Majesty's Dominions in Europe, for which Purpose a Licence have been granted by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Persons who may be duly authorised in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned; which Licence shall continue and be in Force for Nine Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which such Licence is respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no such Licence as aforesaid, granted after the Thirtieth Day of September next, shall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Vessel, to whom such Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the said Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour, or Place in the Island of Newfoundland, where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, deliver up the said Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs there, having first indorsed on the Back of such Licence the Marks, Numbers, and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and the Number of Live Stock, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the said Act mentioned; and the Collector or other proper Officer of the Customs at Newfoundland is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Master or Person having the Charge or Command of such Ship or Vessel, or his having received the said Licence so indorsed as before directed, and to transmit the same to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, respectively, by whom such Licence was granted.

Copy of a Letter from the Right Honorable Lord Keith, K. B. Admiral of the Blue, &c. to William Marsden, Esq; dated at Ramsgate, the 21st Instant.

SIR,

BE pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that the Hired Cutter Active (2d) has just returned to Ramsgate; and to lay before them the enclosed Copy of a Letter which I have received from Lieutenant Williams, at present acting in the Command of her, acquainting me with his having, Yesterday, fallen in with Sixteen Sail of the Enemy's small Craft, proceeding from Ostend to Boulogne, one of which he has captured under Circumstances very creditable to himself and the Cutter's Crew.

His Majesty's Hired Armed Cutter Active (2), off Gravelines, 20th

February 1804.

IN obedience to your Lordship's Order to me of the 17th Instant, I proceeded with His Majesty's Hired Cutter Active, under my Command, to cruise off Dunkirk, but the Wind blowing strong from the Eastward, prevented my getting any farther to Windward than Gravelines, where I this Morning discovered Sixteen Sail of the Enemy's Gun Boats and Transports running close along Shore. I immediately gave chase, and at Half-past Ten commenced a running Fight. At Eleven the outermost Vessel struck her Colours; she proves to be La Jeune Isabella Transport, fitted for carrying Horses, bound to Boulogne from Ostend; I am sorry to say I was prevented capturing any more of the Enemy's Vessels from their having run so close in Shore and under the Batteries during the Time I was taking Possession of this Vessel. The Conduct of the small Crew I command, while attacking so very superior a Force of the Enemy, and under their Batteries, within Three Quarters Mile of the Shore, merits my warmest Thanks, and I hope will your Lordship's Approbation.

That the Counsel for the Sitting Member, Charles Adams, Esq; delivered in a Statement as follows:

"That the Right of Election in the Borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis, in the County of Dorset, is in the Mayor, Aldermen, Bailiffs, and Capital Burgeffes inhabiting within the Borough, and in Persons seised of entire Freehold: within the said Borough, whether by Descent, Devise, or Purchase, and not split or divided, unless split by Descent or Devise, and not receiving Alms."

"That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the Borough and Town of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis, in the County of Dorset."
