Pari, Nov. 30. There was a report yesterday spread about Town, That the Mareschal de la Ferre was dead, which was the sooner believed, for that it was known before that he was very ill. We are told as well from Germany as Flanders of the great Provision that is making of all sorts of Military Stores, which makes most people believe that the Spring may be Ulthered in with Action, and they who are of opinion that the City of Straburg is aimed at, think they have ground for it. Our Lord Lieutenant is sending the Earl of Tyrone and some other persons, according to the Orders he has received from His Majesty, for England.

Plimouth, Nov. 19. There are now riding in Catwatez above 200 Sail of Merchant-Ships, bound to Portugal, Spain, Italy, and Turkez, as also to the Cannaries, under the Convoy of His Majesties Ships, the Newcastle, Faulcon, and Phanix, who have orders to see them in the respective Ports to which they are bound.

Plimouth, Nov. 23. Yesterday Sailed from hence His Majestics Ship the Newcastle, Captain Russel Commander, with about 200 Merchant, Ships under his Convoy, bound for the Streights, three of which, the smallest whereof is mounted with 28 Guns, are in His Majesties Service, and have on Board the Earl of Plimouths Regiment, confishing of 1200 Men, with Officers, commanded by Lieutenant Coldonel Kirke, except 150 of them, which are on Board the Newcastle, as also 50 Miners raised in Cornwal for the service of Tangier. On board one of the faid Merchant men are likewise 200 Reeruits for the Earl of Dumbartons Regiment. This day ailed likewise His Majesties Ship the Falcon, Capn thin Churchil, and the Phanix, Captain Blagg with so Merchantmen more under their Convoy, bound to the Southwards, and most to the Canaries. They Ruby Prigat, Captain Allen, who is come from Lin-bon, is here, bound for the Powns, The Pearle, Captain Williams, and the Guernsey, Captain Tenant, are going to joyn other of His Majesties Ships to

Cruife in the squedings.

Filmouth, Nov. 22. There has been seen by several of this Town a Comet, which rises about two hours before day in the South East; it has a Tail of about 20 Foot long, pointing towards the North West, the end being of a darkish gloomy colour, but the Star bright and swift in its motion; some say they have seen it ever since Mongledy last, but the most noise of it has been since Tuesday say, sneewisch, many have seen it. Whitehall, Nov. 27, Yesterday morning arrived here Licutenant Collonel Talmash from Tangier, and gave His Majesty an account, That Collonel Sackville, who has now the chief Command (Sir Palmes Fair borne, the late Governor, having been unfortunately wounded with a Musket-Shot on the 24th past, of which he dyed three days after) finding that the Moors began to approach year near to Pole-Fort, and were preparing to Mine it, called a Council of War, and pursuant to what was there refolved, marched out the 27th with 1500 Foot, and 300 Horse, and fell upon the Moors with so much bravery that not withflanding the inequality of their number, and the flout refishance they made, they beat them out of their Trenches, and from their severalf Lines, and gave them a .otal defeat, purfulng them a mile into the Country with a great flaughter of them, filling up their Trenches, and levelling their Lines, and taking two pieces of Cannon, five Colours, and several Prifoners, though with the loss of many Officers and private Soldiers killed and wounded-on our fide, of which a full and particular relation, with a Lift of the Killed and Wounded, is made publick.
