TITION. W Richard Taunton, M. D. James Carthew, Robert Moon, William Pedler, John Jope, William Eales, John Penwarne, William Knight, Jofeph Fitze, John Wetčlake, William Webb, Jofeph Eade, John Borrow, James Rogers, Thomas Penwarne, and Francis Glenville, Burgefles of the Borough of Liffkeard, in the County of Cornwall, having this Day prefented their Petition to the Houfe of Com-mons, fetting forth.

Day prefented their Petition to the Houle of Com-mons, fetting forth, That at the laft Election of Burgeffes to ferve in this prefent Parliament for the faid Borough, held on the Sixth of July One thousand eight hundred and two, the Honorable John Eliot and the Peti-tioner William Eliot, and Thomas Sheridan and William Ogilvie, Efquires, were Candidates; and that the late Mayor of the faid Borough, who acted as Returning Officer, returned the faid John Eliot and William Eliot duly elected to ferve in Parlia ment as Burgeffes of the faid Borough; againft which Return Two Petitions were prefented to the which Return Two Petitions were prefented to the Houle, one on Behalf of the faid Thomas Sheridan and William Ogilvie, Efquires, and one on Behalf of Samuel Mitchell and others, reprefenting themfelves to be Inhabitants, Houfeholders, of the faid Borough, paying, or liable to pay, Scot and Lot; ftating (amongfi other Things) that the faid Tho-mas Sheridan and William Ogilvie ought to have been duly elected to ferve as Burgeffes in Parliament for the faid Borough, they having a Majority of legal Votes; and that, on Friday the Twenty-fifth Day of February laft, a Select Committee of the House was appointed to try the Merits of the faid Petitions; and that the Committee, on the Hearing of the faid Petitione, required the Parties Rights of Election in the faid Borough for which they respectively contended; and that the State-ment delivered in by the Petitioners before the faid Committee stated the Right of Election in the faid Borough to be in the Inhabitants paying, or liable to pay, Scot and Lot; and that the Statement de-livered in by the faid John Eliot and William Eliot flated the Right of Election to be in the Mayor and Burgefles of the faid Borough; and that the faid Select Committee, and therefore praying the

faid Committee, after having heard the Evidence adduced by the faid feveral Parties, in Provides the Right of Election fo flated to the faid Constitute as aforefaid, determined that the Right of Elector of Bargeffes to ferve in Parliament for the faid Boor Bargenes to jerve in Parliament for the lake Bo-rough was not in the Inhabitants paying, or flable to pay, Scot and Lot; and that the faid Committee alfo determined, that the Right of Election for Burgeffes to ferve in Parliament for the laid Bo-rough was in the Mayor and Burgeffes of the faid Borough : and that the faid Refolutions were accordingly reported by the faid Sele& Committee to the Houfe: and that, on the Twentieth Day of December last, a Petition was prefeated to the House by Samuel Mitchell, and the several other Perfons whole Names are thereunto fublerioed, flating the feveral Matters and Things hereinbefore flated; also that the Petitioners were advited that the faid Refolutions and Determination of the faid Select Committee on the faid Right of Election was contrary to Law, and therefore praying that they might be admitted as Parties to oppole that Right of Election which had been deemed valid in the Judgment of the faid Committee as aforefaid, and Judgment of the laid Committee as aroraida, and to fupport and ellablish the faid Right of Election for which they contended before the faid Select Committee, which was negatived by the faid Select Committee, or fuch other Right as should be con-filtent with Law, and that fuch Relief might be granted to them as the Justice of the Cafe might require ; and that Joseph Childs, of Liskeard afore faid, Gentleman, on the faid Twentieth Day of laid, Geatteman, on the laid I wentieth Day of December, prefented a Petition to the House, therein flating himfelf to be an Inhabitant of the faid Borough of Lifkeard, paying, or liable to pay, Scot and Lot there; also flating to the Effect of the feveral Matters and Things contained in the laft-mentioned Petition, and therefore praying the House would admit him as a Party to oppose the Right of Election that had been deemed valid in the Judg-ment of the faid Select Committee as aforefaid, and grant him fuch other Relief as to the Houfe fhould freem meet; and that the Petitioners are adviled, and humbly contend, that the Right of Election of Burgeflee to ferve in Parliament for the faid Bo-

House that they may be admitted Parties to defend and fupport the Right of Election for which the faid other Petitioners contended before the faid Seleft Committee, or any other Right which may be attempted to be established by them, or any of them, and that fuch Relief may be granted to the Peti-

tioners as the Juffice of the Cale may require: And the House having appointed Tuesday the Tenth Day of April next, at Three of the Clock in the Afternoon, to take the faid Petitien into Confideration, I do hereby Notice, that the Houfe will at that Time take the faid Petition into Confideration.
