Westminster, March 9, 1804. HIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, au-thorifed by virtue of His Majefly's Commission for de-claring His Royal Affent to feveral Alls agreed upon by both Houses, do defire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House is the House of Peers to hear the Com-willing and the Component heing come this the million read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commiffion, empowering the Lord Arch-bishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal

Affent given to An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters

An Act for the Regulation of His Majefty's Royal Marine Forces while on Shore.

An A& to continue, until Three Months after An Act to continue, that Three Robins after any Reftriction imposed by any Act of the prefent Seffion of Parliament on the Bank of England, from iffuing Cafh in Payment shall ceafe, an Act made in the Parliament of Ireland in the Thirty-feventh Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, for confirming and continuing the Reftrictions on Rayments in Cash by the Bank of Ireland; and allo an Act, made in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for amending the faid Act.

An Act to enable His Majefty to grant the In-heritance in Fee-Simple of certain Manors, Mef-fuages, Lands, and Hereditaments in the Parishes of Byfleet, Weybridge, Walton, Walton Leigh, and Chertfey, in the County of Surrey, to His Royal Highness Frederick Duke of York and Albany for a valuable Confideration.

An Act to indemnify all Perfons who have been concerned in illuing or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commillioners of His Majefty's Treasury, for permitting the Exportation of Seed Corn to Portugal from Great Britain.

An Act for allowing Veffels employed in the Greenland Whale Fifhery, and clearing out from any Port in Great Britain, to complete their full Number of Men at certain Ports for the prefent Scalon.

An A& for further continuing, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, an A& made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty for rendering the Payment of Creditors more equal and expeditious in Scotland.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money for carrying into execution an Act paffed in the For-tieth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for making Wet Docks, Balons, Cuts, and other Works for the greater Accommodation and Security of Shipping, Commerce, and Revenue, within the Port of London.

An Act for keeping in Repair the Roads lead-ing from Saint Dunftan's Crofs to North Lane, near to the City of Canterbury, and to the Sea

Side at Whitstable, in the County of Kent. An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts paffed in the Fourth and Twenty-fourth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty King George the Third, for repairing and widening the Road from Bramcote Odd Houfe, in the County of Nottingham, to the Crofs Poft upon Smalley Com-mon in the County of Derby and other Postmon, in the County of Derby, and other Roads therein mentioned.

An Act to continue and amend an Act paffed in

An Act to continue and amend an Act paffed in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for repairing the Road from the Trent-Bridge, in the County of the Town of Nottingham, to Cote's-Bridge, in the County of Leicefler. An Act for continuing the Term, and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts, paffed in the Second and Fifth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for repairing the Road from Mullen's-Pond, in the County of Southampton, to the Eighteen Mile Stone from the City of Salifbury, and leveral other Roads in the faid Acts mentioned.
