Extra8 of a Letter from the Governor in Council at Bombay, to the Court of Dire8ors, dated 3d September 1803.

MAJOR-GENERAL WELLESLEY having com-menced his Operations against the Fortress of Ahmednagur, on the 8th of August, we had the Satisfaction to learn that the above-mentioned Fortrefs fell into the Major-General's Hands on the 11th following. The Atchievement of this En-11th following. terprife was attended with the Lofs of feveral brave Officers and Men, as will appear by the Lift of the former inferted in the Margin \*; but the Acouliition of it is of great Importance, as it is confidered to be one of the ftrongest Positions in that Country: On this Ground, therefore, General Wellesley has for the present taken Possession of the Fort and Districts dependent thereon, and placed them under the Management of Captain Graham, of the Madras Eftablishment, with Orders to colleft the Revenues, and to render the Refources of that Acquisition as subservient as possible to the Objects of the Campaign. In advising of this Refult, we beg Leave to offer to your Honorable Court our Congratulations on the diffinguished and rapid Succels which attended the British Arms under the Direction of the Honorable Major-General Wellefley, in the Reduction of Ahmednagur; trufting alfo, that we shall shortly be enabled to report an equally favourable Refult with refpect to the Fort of Broach, the Meafures for reducing of which are now in Progrefs.

Whitehall, March 31, 1804. To Major-General Wellefley, Commander in Chief, Sc. Sc. Sc. SIR,

HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, that at three o'Clock; P. M. I ftormed the Firt of Broach, and carried it with little Lois, although the Araba made confiderable Refiftance, particularly on our en-tering the Breach. The Arabs have fuff-red very confiderably, and we have taken a great many Stand of Colours. A more fleep Afcent to the Breach, and of fuch Length, is feldom feen. I cannot ex. prefs mylelf in fufficient Terms on the Gallantry of the Officers and Men I have the Honor to Command. I shall have the Honor to address you more fully To-morrow. I write this for your early Infor-mation, immediately after we have got Poffeffior of the Place, which will, I hope, be an Excuse for Hafte.
